SUPPLEMENTAL FILING OF LUMBERTON MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT TO AMEND CERTIFICATES OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY IN HARDIN COUNTY, TEXAS

TO THE HONORABLE PUBLIC UTITLITY COMMISION OF TEXAS:

The Lumberton Municipal Utility District ("the District and/or Petitioner") files this petition to amend its sewer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity No. 20376 and water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") No. 10929.

I. BACKGROUND

- The District is authorized to provide retail water and sewer service under sewer CCN No. 20367
 and water CCN No. 10929 in certain areas in Hardin County.
- 2. The District filed its amended application to amend its CCN on June 2, 2021.
- 3. On July 1, 2021, the District received the Commission Staff's Recommendation on Administrative Completeness and Notice and Proposed Procedural Schedule.
- 4. On July 21, 2021, the District filed supplemental information to also request an amendment to its sewer CCN number 20367.
- 5. On July 22, 2021, the District filed supplemental mapping information along with additional information requested by the PUCT.
- 6. On August 25, 2021 the administrative law judge ("ALJ") found the amended application, as supplemented, administratively complete and provided a procedural schedule.

- 7. On October 5, 2021, the District filed supplemental information regarding providing notice to the affected landowners but at the time of the filing the District did not have the Publisher's Affidavit.
- 8. On October 13, 2021, the District filed additional information which included the Publisher's Affidavit showing the notice to landowners was published in the *Beaumont Enterprise* on September 25, 2021 and October 2, 2021.
- On October 15, 2021, the District received Commission Staff's Recommendation on Sufficiency
 of Notice and Proposed Procedural Schedule indicating the notice was insufficient.

II. DISTRICT'S RESPONSE TO INSUFFICEINT NOTICE

- On October 22, 2021, the District provided notice to the City of Lumberton, Water Necessities,
 Inc., Lower Neches Valley Authority, Hardin County (Judge Wayne McDaniel), and Southeast
 Texas Groundwater Conservation District. See Attachment A and B.
- On October 27, 2021, the District provided an amended notice to affected landowners per request by Commission Staff and included the map provided by Commission Staff. See Attachment A and C.
- 3. Lastly, the Commission Staff stated that the notice published in the paper did not comply with 16 TAC § 24.235(c) because the newspaper was not published in Hardin County but rather Jefferson County. The District adopted Resolution 2021-8 on August 16, 2021 designating the Beaumont Enterprise as its newspaper for publication pursuant to §2051.047 and 2051.049, Texas Government Code. See Attachment D. Although the Beaumont Enterprise, is published in Jefferson County, numerous Hardin County residents receive the Beaumont Enterprise because it is the largest newspaper in the area. Additionally, the Beaumont Enterprise is one of the few newspapers in the area that publishes a paper every day. The District publishes all legal

notices, including but not limited to, election notices and public hearing notices, in the *Beaumont Enterprise*. As a result, the District utilized the *Beaumont Enterprise* to publish the notice regarding its CCN Amendment and published the notice on September 25 and October 2. For the reasons above, the District is requesting a good cause exception under 16 TAC § 22.5(b) to the requirement in 16 TAC § 24.235(c) that notice must be published in the county where a CCN amendment is being requested.

III. PRAYER

Petitioners respectfully request the Commission to approve the supplemental filing of Lumberton Municipal Utility District water and sewer CCN, find the notice requirements have been satisfied, and find a good cause exception exist under 16 TAC § 22.5(b).
