Dear Chairman Peter Lake and Commissioners.

I am writing to formally oppose any electric utility rate change to El Paso County rate payers as a result of El Paso Electric's (EPE) Application for Distribution Cost Recovery Factor/Transmission Cost Recovery Factor and Fuel Surcharge filed before the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) on June 1, 2021 and September 15, 2021, respectively.

El Paso County Residents are facing record inflation further amplifying financial burdens created during the pandemic. Understandably, EPE needs to cover costs associated with significant investments into it's generation, transmission and distribution systems since its last base rate increase in 2017. However, El Paso County rate payers are witnessing cumulative increased rates for water, electricity, and gas. Texas Gas Service has inequitably placed the financial burden of recovering extraordinary costs from Winter Storm Uri on El Paso County customers when they have not incurred these costs. El Paso Water is also considering rate increases to cover stormwater infrastructure costs. EPE's rate increase would further exacerbate the financial impact on local constituents when our nation has not fully recovered form the pandemic.
