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PETITION OF MERITAGE HOMES OF TEXAS, LLC, TO AMEND THE CITY OF MELISSA'S CERTIFICATE OF TEXAS CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY IN COLLIN COUNTY BY EXPEDITED RELEASE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION

COMMISSION STAFF'S FINAL RECOMMENDATION

On June 30, 2021, Meritage Homes of Texas, LLC (Meritage Homes) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from City of Melissa's (Melissa) water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11482 under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h).¹ Meritage Homes asserts that the land to be released is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Collin County, which is a qualifying county.

On September 24, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 7, establishing a deadline of October 28, 2021 for the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file its recommendation on final disposition. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. FINAL RECOMMENDATION

Staff has reviewed the petition and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Jolie Mathis, Infrastructure Division, Staff recommends that the petition be approved. Staff recommends that Meritage Homes has met the requirements of TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), and further recommends that the petition for release of the requested area from city of Melissa's CCN No. 11482 be granted. The final water CCN map and certificate are attached hereto and Staff recommends that they be provided to Meritage Homes.

¹ On August 19, 2021, Order No. 1 in Docket 52442 was filed by the administrative law judge granting the request by Meritage Homes to sever its petition to amend North Collin Special Utility District's CCN by expedited release from this pending petition in Docket No. 52293 and requiring Meritage to file a clean copy of this petition by August 23, 2021. This proceeding, Docket No. 52293, will address the petition of Meritage Homes for streamlined expedited release from water CCN No. 11482 held by City of Melissa in Collin County.

II. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff respectfully recommends that the petition be approved and that the Commission issue an order consistent with this recommendation.

On June 30, 2021, Meritage Homes of Texas, LLC (Meritage Homes) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from City of Melissa's water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11482 in Collin County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h).¹ Meritage Homes asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Collin County, which is a qualifying county.

Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, determined the map and digital data are sufficient for determining the location of the tract of land considered for streamlined expedited release is located within City of Melissa's water CCN. Furthermore, Meritage Homes provided a warranty deed confirming ownership of the tract of land within City of Melissa's certificated service area. In addition, Meritage Homes submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the property was not receiving water service from the CCN holder.


The tract of land is approximately 273.5 acres. The area to be released from City of Melissa (CCN No. 11482) is approximately 199.9 acres.

City of Melissa did not request to intervene.

¹ On August 19, 2021, Order No. 1 in Docket 52442 was filed by the administrative law judge granting the request by Meritage Homes to sever its petition to amend North Collin Special Utility District's CCN by expedited release from this pending petition in Docket No. 52293 and requiring Meritage to file a clean copy of this petition by August 23, 2021. This proceeding, Docket No. 52293, will address the petition of Meritage Homes for streamlined expedited release from water CCN No. 11482 held by City of Melissa in Collin County.

In accordance with TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), Meritage Homes has met the Commission's requirements to allow for the release of the tract of land from City of Melissa's CCN No. 11482. Therefore, I recommend approval of the petition. Enclosed is a final map and certificate for Commission approval.

Additionally, I recommend that a final map and certificate be provided to the CCN holder.
