To the Public Utility Commission:

White Rock Water Supply Corporation filed a petition with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to convert White Rock Water Supply Corporation to White Rock Water Special Utility District. White Rock Water Special Utility District purchases water from Bistone Municipal Water Supply District and City of Mexia. It is a Special Utility District existing and operating under Article XVI, Section 59 of the Texas Constitution. The Special Utility District submits the following information to the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUCT") pursuant to Texas Water Code § 13.1396 as an affected utility under Texas Water Code §13.1394. Additionally, this information will also be submitted to each transmission and distribution service provider, each retail electric provider, and the Limestone County Office of Emergency Management where the District has water or sewer facilities that qualify for critical load status.

The District has identified facilities as qualifying for critical load status. Information providing the general description and location of these critical load facilities are included as **Exhibit A.**

REVISED NOTICE OF DISTRICT PETITION

TCEQ Internal Control No. 06192007-D02

PETITION. White Rock Water Supply Corporation (Petitioner) has filed a petition with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to convert White Rock Water Supply Corporation to White Rock Special Utility District (District), to transfer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12547 from White Rock Water Supply Corporation to White Rock Special Utility District. White Rock Special Utility District's business address will be: 841 LCR 463, Mexia, Texas 76667. The petition was filed pursuant to Chapters 49 and 65 of the Texas Water Code; 30 Texas Administrative Code Chapter 293; and the procedural rules of the TCEQ.

The nature and purpose of the petition are for the conversion of White Rock Water Supply Corporation and the organization, creation and establishment of White Rock Special Utility District under the provisions of Article XVI, Section 59, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 65 of the Texas Water Code, as amended. The District shall have the purposes and powers provided in Chapter 65 of the Texas Water Code, and CCN No. 12547 shall be transferred as provided in Chapter 13, of the Texas Water Code, as amended. The nature of the services presently performed by White Rock Water Supply Corporation is to purchase, own, hold, lease and otherwise acquire sources of water supply; to build, operate and maintain facilities for the transportation of water; and to sell water to individual members, towns, cities, private businesses, and other political subdivisions of the State. The nature of the services proposed to be provided by White Rock Special Utility District is to purchase, own, hold, lease, and otherwise acquire sources of water supply; to build, operate, and maintain facilities for the storage, treatment, and transportation of water, and to sell water to individuals, towns, cities, private business entities and other political subdivisions of the State. Additionally, it is proposed that the District will protect, preserve and restore the purity and sanitary condition of the water within the District. It is anticipated that conversion will have no adverse effects on the rates and services provided to the customers.

The proposed District, consisting of two areas "A" and "B", is located in Limestone County and will contain approximately 37,172 acres (20.18 square miles). The territory to be included within the proposed District includes all of the singularly certified service area covered by CCN No. 12547 and is set forth in the following boundary description designated as Exhibit "A" hereto. The proposed District is also depicted in the following vicinity map designated as Exhibit "B" hereto.

CCN No. 12547 will be transferred after a positive confirmation election.

CONTESTED CASE HEARING. The TCEQ may grant a contested case hearing on this petition if a written hearing request is filed within 30 days after the newspaper publication of this notice.

To request a contested case hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) the name of the petitioner and the TCEQ Internal Control Number; (3) the statement "I/we request a contested case hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you would be affected by the petition in a way not common to the general public; and (5) the location of your property relative to the proposed district's boundaries. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the petition which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted in writing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address provided in the information section below.

The Executive Director may approve the petition unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 30 days after the newspaper publication of this notice. If a hearing request is filed, the Executive Director may not approve the petition and will forward the petition and hearing request to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. If a contested case hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

DESCRIPTION OF WHITE ROCK W.S.C. AREA "A"

Beginning at a point where the Southern Pacific Railroad crosses the Navasota River;

Thence northwesterly along and with the center streamline of the Navasota River to a point perpendicular to County Road 404;

Thence southwesterly along and with County Road 404 and continuing along to a point on Texas Highway 14;

Thence southerly approximately 0.3 miles along and with Texas Highway 14, to a point;

Thence westerly approximately 300 feet, to a point;

Thence southerly approximately 0.5 miles, parallel with Texas Highway 14 to a point on a Tract, for a projection line due southwest;

Thence southwesterly approximately 1.28 miles along and with said Tract, for a projection line due north;

Thence southerly approximately 300 feet, to a point for a projection line due southwest;

Thence southwesterly approximately 300 feet, to a point for a projection line due west;

Thence approximately 0.5 miles, to a point on FM 1245;

Thence northwesterly along and with FM 1245, to a point on County Road 368;

Thence northwesterly along and with County Road 368, to a point on the intersection of County Road 368 and County Road 374;

Thence northeasterly along an with the County Road 374 approximately 3 miles to a point;

Thence northwesterly, to a point on the southern line of Lake Mexia Shoreline;

Thence along and with the southern line of the Lake Mexia shoreline, to a point on the Lake Mexia Dam and County Road 377,

Thence easterly, along and with County Road 377, to a point in the intersection of FM 2705 and County Road 476;

Thence easterly, along County Road 476, to a point on County Road 474;



Thence southeasterly, along and with County Road 474, to a point on FM 1633;

Thence easterly, along and with FM 1633, to a point on County Road 470;

Thence easterly, along and with the County Road 470, to a point on County Road 472;

Thence northerly, along and with County Road 472, to a point on County Road 474;

Thence northeasterly, along and with County Road 474, to a point on US-Hwy 84;

Thence easterly, along and with US-Hwy 84, to a point on where Plummers Creek crosses, for a projection line due southeast;

Thence southeasterly, to a point on FM 1633, where Plummers Creek crosses;

Thence, southeasterly, to a point on Texas Highway 14, where Plummers Creek crosses;

Thence easterly, along and with Plummers Creek and City of Mexia city limits, approximately 160 feet, to a point;

Thence northerly, along and with the City of Mexia city limits; approximately 0.25 miles to a point on a tangent curve to the right;

Thence, along and with a 0.25 mile radius curve to the right, to a point on a tangent curve to the left:

Thence, along and with a 0.75 mile radius curve to the left, to a point on the Southern Pacific Railroad;

Thence southernly along and with the Southern Pacific Railroad, to the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 32,927 acres, more or less.

DESCRIPTION OF WHITE ROCK W.S.C. AREA "B"

Beginning at the intersection of FM 2838 and County Road 200;

Thence northwesterly, along and with County Road 200, to a point on County Road 203;

Thence westerly, along and with County Road 203 passing County Road 239 for a projection line due east, to a point on Texas Highway 171;

Thence southeasterly, along and with Texas Highway 171, to a point on County Road 240;

Thence southeasterly, along and with County Road 240 passing County Road 241 and continuing along, to a point on County Road 242;

Thence southwesterly, along and with County Road 242, to a point on the intersection of Texas Highway 171 and FM 2838, and continuing along the south side of FM 2838 to a point on County Road 209;


Thence southeasterly, along and with the northern side of County Road 209 approximately 0.5 miles to a point;

Thence northwesterly along and with the southern side of County Road 209 approximately 0.5 to a point on FM 2838;

Thence southwesterly, along and with the south side FM 2838 approximately 1 mile to a point;

Thence across the FM 2838 and southwesterly, along and with the north side of FM 2838 for the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 3,204 acres, more or less, with the exclusion of Mexia State School property.
