Hi,

This rate is for water ONLY>>>

Since Kevin is not in, I wanted to send my concerns and thoughts so hopefully someone will take what I am saying seriously.

I do not think that the PUC is following what the Texas Water Code Chapter 13 is intending for you to do.

The PUC is suppose to operate as the competition, since with a CCN, you can consider East Houston Utilites as being a monopoly.

At the rate that I was told the PUC came up with \$163.00 for a base, that is not considered a competitive rate in our area. Several of us (Whitewing Subdivision Residents) have called around and we can NOT find one water utility in our area that has a base rate higher than the \$50.00 range. Most are in the \$30.00 range. Our subdivision has offered a counteroffer of \$50.00 as a base with 3000 gallons. East Houston Utilities is looking at it. But with the PUC rate being so HIGH, if we end up going before a judge, it is going to be hard to compete with your findings, since the judge is going to think the PUC knows what they are doing. I know I am being harsh, but I am extremely frustrated, I talked to Kevin one time at the very beginning of this rate increase activity, but Kevin has not responded to my later emails. nor can I get a call back from his paralegal. So, the rate I am using is what I heard from the Whitewing persons that are attending the negotiations, and Kevin would not confirm the rate for me, since he never responded to my emails.

No matter what East Houston Utilities has come up with for their expenses, they did not pay for the water utility that the Whitewing Subdivision uses, it was GIFTED to them by Fred and Marilyn (previous owners), nor has East Houston Utilities put out money for any major expenditures except putting in a second well that we do not need. We tried to get East Houston Utilities to put in a generator instead because we lose power out

here quite often and then we have no water. In the END, it is NOT the responsibility of of the Whitewing residents to make up for East Houston Utilities having bad management practices.

I agree that East Houston Utilities needs to increase the rate some, but it needs to be reasonable per Texas Water Code Chapter 13 and anything above the \$50.00 range I would NOT consider reasonable, because nobody else in this area charges more than that.

I don't know how you guys can fix this, but please do.

## Hi,

I have been thinking about why the PUC would come up with such a large rate increase for East Houston Utility.

I have come to the conclusion that somewhere along the way that our attorney (you), have lost sight of what your responsibilities are towards your customers (us).

So, I think that since East Houston Utility is considered a monopoly according to the Texas

Water Code, Chapter 13, Section 13.001 (b) and you are considered our counsel per Sec13.017 (b), that I should include the document for you to read your responsibilities and refresh your memory on what your role is in these proceedings.

The rate of \$163.00 per 5000 gallons of water that I understand the PUC came up with, is not considered just and reasonable for the consumer as described in Section 13.001 (c). I called around in our area and could not find one water utility that was above \$50.00 range. I would like you to point out in our area (Dayton, Texas) a rural water utility that charges this rate, since you seem to think it is just and reasonable. Do you pay this much for water? There are several rural utilities in our surrounding area, so you shouldn't have any trouble finding one.

The other utilities the PUC used for comparisons to come up with the \$163.00 do not even compare to our rural community water system. They

also are not all even in the state of Texas.

The rural utility which is closest to us is, AquaTech and their rates are \$38.50 for 0 gallons of water and then \$2.96 per each additional 1000 gallons. This rate is just and reasonable and I bet they weren't even "gifted" their utility like East Houston was.
