ORDER NO. 3 FINDING APPLICATION REMAINS INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT AND ESTABLISHING AN OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses the sufficiency of the August 13, 2021 application of Patterson Water Supply LLC and Myra Water System for sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Cooke County. The applicants have not filed a response to Order No. 2 requiring that the applicants supplement their application to cure the deficiencies.

The administrative law judge finds the application remains administratively incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before November 5, 2021, the applicants must supplement the application to cure the deficiencies as described in the September 13, 2021 memoranda of Patricia Garcia and Fred Bednarski III. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. The applicants must not issue notice until the application is deemed administratively complete.

On or before November 19, 2021, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
