JOINT STATUS UPDATE AND REQUEST TO EXTEND PROCEDURAL DEADLINE

Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC (“Oncor”) files this Status Update and Request to Extend Procedural Deadline (“Status Update”) respectfully showing as follows:

On August 26, 2021, Oncor filed an application for a certificate of convenience and necessity with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (“Commission”) for the Old Country Switch 345-kilovolt transmission line project. Between September 29 and October 20, 2021, the Commission Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) granted intervention to Ms. Anne Weary; Lone Star Texas Land & Cattle Company, LLC; Chambers Creek Ranch LLC; Ms. Vicki Coffman; and Mr. Luke Tamminga (collectively with Oncor and Commission Staff, the “Parties”). On October 27, 2021, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (“TPWD”) filed a letter containing its recommended beneficial management practices for protecting fish and wildlife during construction of the project. On November 10, 2021, the Commission ALJ referred this matter to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (“SOAH”). On December 13, 2021, the SOAH ALJs referred the matter to the SOAH Alternative Dispute Resolution Team Leader for mediation. And on February 8, 2022, all Parties participated in a mediation.

The mediation has resulted in an agreement in principle that will resolve all issues contested between the Parties, contingent on execution of a letter agreement addressing TPWD’s recommendations. Oncor has agreed to move for abatement of the procedural schedule once the letter agreement is executed. Oncor also agreed to update the Parties on the status of the letter agreement via email by Monday, February 14, 2022. Accordingly, on that date, Oncor conferred with the Parties and provided them with an update, which is also provided herein for the record.

Oncor continues to coordinate with Staff and TPWD to finalize the terms of the letter agreement and expects that process to be complete by Wednesday, February 16, 2022. However, Oncor remains mindful that the procedural schedule currently requires intervenors to file direct testimony or statements of position by February 28, 2022. Pursuant to the agreement brokered in mediation, and to ensure that intervenors have adequate time to prepare testimony or statements of position in the event that consensus on the letter agreement cannot be reached, Oncor respectfully requests that the deadline for intervenor testimony be extended to March 7, 2022. As previously agreed, Oncor will move to abate the procedural schedule altogether once the letter agreement is executed. No parties have opposed this request.
