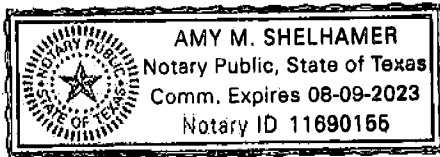
1. My name is Michael K. Knapp. I am employed by Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS") as Case Specialist. I am authorized to make this affidavit and I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein.
2. On August 27, 2021, SPS filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas an application to amend SPS's Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to convert Harrington Generating Station from coal to natural gas. The application has been assigned PUC Docket No. 52485.
3. On August 27, 2021, SPS served notice of the application by email to all parties of record in SPS most recent rate case, Docket No. 51802. A list of those parties is attached as Exhibit A.
4. SPS served notice of the application by mail to the City of Amarillo, the County Judge of Potter County, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, and all directly affected landowners. A list of these entities, their addresses, and the date notice was mailed is attached as Exhibit B.
5. SPS published notice in the *Amarillo Globe News*, *Booker News*, *Caprock Courier*, *County Star*, *Dalhart Texan*, *Lubbock Avalanche-Journal*, *Miami Chief*, *Muleshoe Journal*, *Pampa News*, and *Sherman County Gazette* newspapers of general circulation in counties served by SPS.

6. SPS has not received a publisher's affidavit from the *Dalhart Texan* but continues to communicate with their offices and expects an executed publisher's affidavit soon.
7. For all of the above newspapers except the *Dalhart Texan*, Copies of the Publishers' Affidavit forms and tear sheets verifying the publication of notice in each newspaper are attached as Exhibit C.

Shafer Mortuary Services LLC, 311 South Bivins Street, Amarillo, Texas 79104-1407 has applied to the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an Air Quality Standard Permit, Registration Number 166681, which would authorize construction of an animal carcass incinerator. The facility is proposed to be located at 307 South Bivins Street, Amarillo, Potter County, Texas 79104. The executive director shall approve or deny the application not later than 30 days after the end of the public comment period, considering all comments received within the comment period, and base this decision on whether the application meets the requirements of the standard permit.

On August 27, 2021, Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS"), doing business as Xcel Energy, filed a petition with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUC") requesting approval of an amendment to its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") authorization pursuant to Public Utility Regulatory Act ("PURA") §§ 37.056 and 37.058 to convert all three generation units at Harrington Generating Station from coal generation to natural gas generation. The application also asks the PUC to select a route for a natural gas pipeline SPS proposes to construct, own, and operate to provide natural gas supply to Harrington Generating Station. The proposed pipeline will run for approximately 20 to 22 miles from an existing pipeline northwest of Amarillo, Texas to Harrington Generating Station. Detailed maps of the proposed pipeline routes may be viewed at the project website at: <https://www.xcelenergy.com/Harrington>. The proposed conversion is designed to improve National Ambient Air Quality Standards emission performance and is the outcome of an agreed order between SPS and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. The estimate for the cost of conversion is approximately \$45 to \$75 million total company, of which \$45 to \$52 million is allocable to Texas.

The docket number and style of the case are PUC Docket No. 52485. *Application of Southwestern Public Service Company to Amend its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Convert Harrington Generating Station from Coal to Natural Gas.*

Approval of the Application will affect all of SPS's customers in all areas of its service territory, but SPS is not seeking to change its rates in this proceeding.

The deadline for intervention in this proceeding is November 19, 2021, and the PUC should receive your request to intervene by that date. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, persons who are affected by the proposed conversion and wish to intervene in the docket or comment on SPS's application should file materials electronically, and you will be required to serve the request on other parties by email. 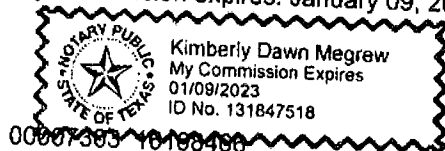

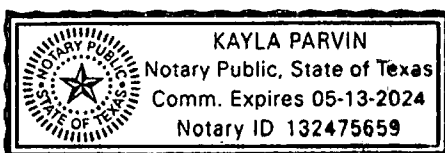

hope those counts are under-represented.

The Abilene Reporter-News and the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal as recently as a decade ago had robust newsrooms of more than 50 staffers covering their cities and counties that surrounded them, but no more. The Abilene newsroom now has a staff of nine, as does the A-J.

That's what the staff directories on their websites say. Hopefully, those numbers are underrepresented.

The page counts are down, too, and many stories have a statewide or regional focus from their shared newsrooms. In Texas, Gannett owns the newspapers in Abilene, Ama-

rillo, Austin, Corpus Christi, El Paso, Lubbock, San Angelo and Wichita Falls.

Local coverage in these newspapers has plummeted. Weekly newspapers are a different animal. Daily newspapers appear to be unsure how to get by on a shoestring budget, but weeklies have always existed in a resource-restricted environment and have had to figure out ways to cover the news with limited resources.

Our weekly newspapers may not have a lot of employees, but we have set a goal to work with volunteers, stringers, freelancers and contractors to deliver the information that binds the community together.

In the absence of local coverage, all news succumbs to the

onslaught of national coverage. Instead of reading about local policy decisions, people read about the blacklisting of Dr. Seuss books. Instead of learning about their own local candidates, they consume angry takes about Marjorie Taylor Greene or AOC. Instead of discovering what matters to their neighbors, they're fed issues from fights taking place far away.

Picking sides and demonizing those we disagree with replaces real news.

In this corner, I'd rather have a cup of coffee with someone and talk about what we can do in our Caprock County towns to revitalize our downtowns and give our kids reasons to move back home when they graduate.

vice, using mass transit or calling a sober friend.

TXDOT's Drive Sober, No Regrets campaign is conducting outreach events at college campuses across the state in conjunction with football season. The events include video testimonials of Texans who deal with the daily consequences of drunk driving, either as a survivor or offender.

Covid-19 cases still dropping. The number of new Covid-19 cases in the state is steadily dropping, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University, with 45,884 cases reported in the past week, along

with 1,201 new deaths. Both categories are down more than 20% compared to the previous week. Lab-confirmed Covid-19 hospitalizations in Texas also continue to drop, with 6,730 reported Sunday by the Texas Department of State Health Services, a drop of 18% from the previous week.

The number of Texans fully vaccinated has crossed the 15 million mark, which is 51.6 percent of the state's total population.

Arts commission seeks 'young masters.' The Texas Commission on the Arts and the Texas Cultural Trust are seeking applications for the 2022 class of Young Masters. The program provides "ex-

emplary Texas-based arts students" in grades 8-11 with financial assistance to pursue study in various areas of the arts, such as visual, literary, folk arts, music, dance, theater and media art.

needed to write his own songs.

"I fully believe the reason I'm here is because I showed up

in that backyard," said Martin.

His first single came out in 2018, followed by the album "Mama's Favorite" in 2019. Inspirations that include George

Jones, Tom T. Hall, Jason Isbell and Bowling for Soup were also discussed in Martin's podcast interview with Chris Waterman.

The Siege of Yorktown, October 19, 1781

This coming October 19th marks the 240th anniversary of the victory at Yorktown, Virginia, October 19, 1781. This victory by American and French allies over the British army and navy effectively ended the American Revolutionary War. General George Washington wrote "Articles of Capitulation" in which he set out terms for the British surrender by Lord Charles Cornwallis.

Article III states the procedure of how the British were to be disarmed:

Article III. At twelve o'clock this day the two redoubts on the left flank of York to be delivered, the one to a detachment of American infantry, the other to a detachment of French grenadiers.

Granted.
The garrison of York will march out to a place to be appointed in front of the posts, at two o'clock precisely, with shouldered arms, colors cased, and drums beating a British or German march. They are then to ground their arms, and return to their encampments, where they will remain until they are despatched to the places of their destination. Two works on the Gloucester side will be delivered at one o'clock to a detachment of French and American troops appointed to possess them. The garrison will march out at three o'clock in the afternoon; the cavalry with their swords drawn, trumpets sound-

ing, and the infantry in the manner prescribed for the garrison of York. They are likewise to return to their encampments until they can be finally marched off.

The Americans and their French ally formed two lines facing each other. Then 7,000 British and German soldiers marched between the

two lines and surrendered their weapons, "grounding" them in a heap. At the conclusion of the ceremony, General Washington wrote to the Continental Congress at Philadelphia: "I have the honor to inform Congress that the reduction of the British army under the command of Lord Cornwallis is most

happily effected."

The signatures of the several commanders "granted" the acceptance of each Article of Capitulation.
