

- c. The customer is not currently connected to the Entergy Texas, Inc. system.

ASC 842 defines a lease as "a contract, or part of a contract, that conveys the right to control the use of identified property, plant, or equipment (an identified asset) for a period of time in exchange for consideration." Control is considered to exist if the customer has both of the following:

- The right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from the use of [an identified] asset.
- The right to direct the use of the [identified] asset.
