# COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE

On September 3, 2021, A. J. Malone (Malone) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Marilee Special Utility District's (Marilee SUD) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 10150 under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Malone asserts that the land to be released is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Collin County, which is a qualifying county. On September 16, 2021 Marilee Special Utility District filed a motion to intervene.

On September 8, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of October 4, 2021 for the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff) to file comments regarding the administrative completeness of the petition and notice. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the petition and as detailed in the attached memorandum from Jolie Mathis, Infrastructure Division, recommends that the petition is administratively incomplete. Staff further recommends that Malone be ordered to cure the deficiencies identified in Ms. Mathis' memorandum by November 4, 2021 and that Staff be given a deadline of December 3, 2021 to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the petition.

RECOMMENDATION ON NOTICE II.

Commission Staff recommends that Malone's notice is sufficient and meets the

requirements of 16 TAC § 24.245(h)(3)(F).

PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE III.

In accordance with Staff's deficiency recommendation, Staff does not propose a procedural

schedule for further processing of the docket at this time. Staff intends to propose a procedural

schedule alongside a subsequent recommendation that the petition be found administratively

complete.

IV. **CONCLUSION** 

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the petition be found

administratively incomplete and that Malone be ordered to file supplemental information to cure

the deficiencies in the petition by November 4, 2021. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an

order consistent with these recommendations.

Expedited Release

On September 3, 2021, A.J. Malone (Malone) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Marilee Special Utility District's (Marilee SUD) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10150 in Collin County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Malone asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Collin County, which is a qualifying county.

Based on my technical and managerial review of the information provided by Malone, I recommend the petition be deemed insufficient for filing and found administratively incomplete.

#### **Petition Content:**

The following deficiencies must be remedied:

- 1) A copy of notarized affidavit attesting that the property is not receiving water and sewer services from CCN holders under 16 TAC § 24.245 (h)(3)(D).
- 2) Proof that a copy of the petition was sent via certified mail to CCN holders under 16 TAC § 24.245 (h)(3)(F).
