ORDER NO. 2
FINDING PETITION ADMINISTRATIVELY
INCOMPLETE AND ESTABLISHING OPPORTUNITY
TO CURE, AND GRANTING MOTION TO INTERVENE

This Order addresses the administrative completeness of the September 3, 2021 petition of Clifton Van McKnight and Bryan Jeffrey McKnight to amend New Marilee Special Utility District's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) in Collin County by streamlined expedited release; and Marilee Special Utility District's September 16, 2021 motion to intervene.

I. Petition Completeness

On October 4, 2021, Commission Staff filed a recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the petition. Commission Staff did not address the sufficiency of petitioners' notice.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the petition administratively incomplete for the reasons described in the memorandum of Patricia Garcia, attached to Commission Staff's recommendation.

The following procedural schedule applies for continued processing:

Deadline for Commission Staff to file a supplemental recommendation on sufficiency of the petition and notice and propose a procedural schedule	December 3, 2021

II. Marilee SUD's Motion to Intervene

On September 16, 2021, Marilee SUD filed a motion to intervene in this proceeding. No party objected to the motion. Marilee SUD has established that it has a justiciable interest which may be adversely affected by the outcome of the proceeding. Therefore, the ALJ grants the motion to intervene.
