**ORDER NO. 8**  
**GRANTING COMMISSION STAFF'S REQUEST FOR MORE INFORMATION**

In this matter, E Real Estate, LLC seeks streamlined expedited release from Marilee Special Utility District's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) number 10150 in Collin County.

By motion filed March 3, 2022, Commission Staff asks that the petitioner be required to provide additional information relevant to the question of whether the land for which release is sought is receiving water service. The administrative law judge (ALJ) concludes that the issues raised by Commission Staff warrant a response by the petitioner. By March 18, 2022, the petitioner must file a response, supported by an affidavit, addressing the issues raised in Commission Staff's March 3, 2022 pleading. By April 4, 2022, Commission Staff must file an updated recommendation on final disposition.

The requirement, in Order No. 7, for Commission Staff to file a map and certificate by March 15, 2022 is withdrawn. If, in its updated recommendation on final disposition, Commission Staff recommends granting the petition, it should attach the map and certificate at that time.

Commission Staff's suggestion that it might change the standard procedural schedule it proposes in future dockets is well-taken, but requires no action by the ALJ at this time. Commission Staff is always free to recommend whatever schedule it sees fit.
