ORDER NO. 7
FINDING PETITION DEFICIENT ESTABLISHING
DEADLINES FOR OPPORTUNITY TO CURE, AND RESTYLING DOCKET

This Order addresses the sufficiency of the September 27, 2021 petition of the City of New Boston and Central Bowie County Water Supply Corporation for approval of a service-area contract and to amend certificates of convenience and necessity in Bowie County. On April 7, 2022, Commission Staff filed a supplemental recommendation on administrative completeness and request to restyle the docket.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the petition administratively incomplete under Texas Water Code § 13.248. 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the petition administratively complete.


By May 9, 2022, the petitioners must supplement the petition to cure the deficiencies as described in the April 7, 2022 memorandum of Jolie Mathis. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed.

By June 14, 2022, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the petition, along with a proposed procedural schedule.

The ALJ grants Commission Staff's request to restyle this docket. The docket is restyled as reflected in this Order.
