**ORDER NO. 8**  
**REQUIRING RECOMMENDATION AND PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

This Order requires Commission Staff to provide its recommendation regarding the sufficiency of the document filed by the applicants demonstrating that the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights at issue in this application was completed and that customer deposits were properly handled.

In the Commission's Interim Order filed on August 4, 2022, Commission Staff was ordered to file, within 15 days following the filing of the applicants' proof that the transaction has been consummated and customer deposits, if any, have been addressed, a recommendation regarding the sufficiency of the documents and propose a schedule for continued processing of this docket. On September 13, 2022, the applicants filed a bill of sale and assignment. More than 15 days have elapsed since that filing.

By October 21, 2022, Commission Staff must file its recommendation regarding the sufficiency of applicants' closing document and propose a procedural schedule for further processing.
