### ORDER ON FIRST ANNUAL TRUE-UP ADJUSTMENT

This Order addresses the first annual true-up compliance filing, report of recoveries, and notice of default-charge adjustment (compliance filing) filed by Electric Reliability Council of Texas, Inc. (ERCOT) on September 15, 2022, to comply with the Commission's debt obligation order issued in Docket No. 52321.<sup>1</sup>

On September 21, 2022, Commission Staff filed a recommendation in this docket. Commission Staff recommended that ERCOT's compliance filing be found sufficient and complete. Additionally, Commission Staff recommended that ERCOT's compliance filing and the revised default charges contained in that filing be found in compliance with PURA and the relevant provisions of the debt obligation order.

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, ERCOT's compliance filing is found to be sufficient, complete, and in compliance with PURA and the relevant provisions of the debt obligation order. ERCOT's proposed default charges are approved, as filed, effective starting with the November 2022 billing period.

Further, the Commission delegates authority to the Office of Policy and Docket Management (OPDM) to issue orders in this proceeding that, like this one, find ERCOT's future compliance filings to be sufficient, complete, and in compliance with PURA and the relevant provisions of the debt obligation order and approve proposed default charges. If novel issues arise

or the Docket Management administrative law judge decides that certain issues should be addressed by the Commission, OPDM must bring a proposed order to the Commission for consideration.
