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PROPOSED ORDER APPROVING SEMI-ANNUAL INTERIM TRUE-UP COMPLIANCE FILING

This Order addresses the mandatory, semi-annual interim true-up filing, report of recoveries, and notice of no need for a default charge increase (compliance filing), filed by Electric Reliability Council of Texas, Inc. (ERCOT) on February 14, 2023. This compliance filing was made to comply with the Debt Obligation Order issued by the Public Utility Commission of Texas (the Commission) in Docket No. 52321.¹

On February 17, 2023, Commission Staff filed a recommendation in this docket. Commission Staff recommended that ERCOT's compliance filing be found sufficient and complete. Additionally, Commission Staff recommended that ERCOT's compliance filing and the default charges contained therein be found in compliance with PURA and the relevant provisions of the Debt Obligation Order.

Consistent with Commission Staff's recommendation, ERCOT's compliance filing is found to be sufficient, complete, and in compliance with the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA) and the relevant provisions of the Debt Obligation Order.² As reflected in ERCOT's compliance filing, there is no need for an increase in the default charges, and the default charges previously approved in Order No. 6 shall remain in effect.³
