COMMISSION STAFF'S SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE

On December 3, 2021, Charles D. Carter (Mr. Carter) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Marilee Special Utility District's (Marilee SUD) water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10150 under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Mr. Carter asserts that the land to be released is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Collin County, which Mr. Carter asserts is a qualifying county.

On December 7, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of January 4, 2022 for the Staff of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Staff) to file comments regarding the administrative completeness of the petition and notice. On January 4, 2022, Staff filed its final recommendation which includes two typographical errors which are corrected herein.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the petition, and as detailed in the attached memorandum from Tsungirirai Gotora, Sr., Infrastructure Division, recommends that the petition is administratively incomplete. Staff further recommends that Mr. Carter be ordered to cure the deficiencies identified in Ms. Gotora's memorandum by February 4, 2022 and that Staff be given a deadline of March 7, 2022 to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the petition. Staff respectfully requests adoption of these proposed deadlines as some of the noted deficiencies are related to mapping information and Staff's mapping experts may be required to assist Mr. Carter regarding the supplemental mapping information needed to cure the mapping deficiencies and will require at least thirty days to review same.

II. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with Staff's deficiency recommendation, Staff does not propose a procedural

schedule for further processing of the docket at this time. Staff intends to propose a procedural

schedule alongside a subsequent recommendation that the petition be found administratively

complete.

Ш. **CONCLUSION**

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the petition be found

administratively incomplete, and that Mr. Carter be ordered to file supplemental information to

cure the deficiencies in the petition by February 4, 2022. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an

order consistent with these recommendations. Staff filed its final recommendation which included

two typographical errors, both of which are corrected herein. Staff's ultimate recommendation that

the application remains incomplete for further processing is unaffected by these corrections.

On December 03, 2021, Charles D. Carter (Mr. Carter) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Marilee Special Utility District's (Marilee SUD) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 10150 in Collin County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). Mr. Carter asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Collin County, which is a qualifying county.

Based on the mapping review by Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, and my technical and managerial review of the additional information provided by Mr. Carter, I recommend the petition be deemed insufficient for filing and found administratively incomplete.

Petition Content:

The petition was requested by Mr. Carter; however, the warranty deed shows the landowner as Carter Family Farms, LLC. Please submit a revised petition from the landowner or provide clarification as to why the petition was requested by Mr. Carter.

Mapping Content:

Mr. Carter must submit the following item to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

A revised detailed map identifying the overall deeded tract in reference to the portion
of the tract to be released, shown in reference to verifiable man-made and natural
landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads.

Staff recommends Mr. Carter obtain additional mapping guidance from the PUC's mapping staff, Ms. Tracy Montes, by email at tracy.montes@puc.texas.gov to resolve the mapping deficiencies.

Staff will need at least 30 days to review the documentation, maps, and digital data provided by Mr. Carter and draft a recommendation.
