ORDER NO. 3 FINDING PETITION ADMINISTRATIVELY INCOMPLETE AND PROVIDING OPPORTUNITY TO CURE

This Order addresses the December 3, 2021 petition of Glenda Sue Winker to amend Marilee Special Utility District's water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) in Collin County by streamlined expedited release. On January 4, 2022, Commission Staff filed its recommendation on the administrative completeness of the petition and notice.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) agrees with Commission Staff that the petition is administratively incomplete, and so finds. However, the ALJ disagrees with Commission Staff's recommendation as to how the deficiency should be cured. The petition is filed by Glenda Sue Winker and she is identified as the owner of the tract in question. The only deed provided with the petition, however, indicates that, in 2004, Glenda C. Winker transferred the tract to the Glenda Carter Winker Revocable Trust.

If, in fact, Glenda Sue Winker is the owner of the tract, she must amend the petition by providing a deed demonstrating her ownership. If, on the other hand, the Glenda Carter Winker Revocable Trust remains the owner of the tract, then the petition should be amended such that it is filed in the name of the trustee(s) of the Glenda Carter Winker Revocable Trust, and documentation must be included to demonstrate that the petitioner is (or are) the current trustee(s) and have the authority to act on behalf of the trust.
