**ORDER NO. 9**  
**LIFTING ABATEMENT AND ADMITTING EVIDENCE**

This Order addresses the January 11, 2022 abatement of this proceeding and the October 21, 2022 joint motion to admit evidence filed by Shell Oil Company and Commission Staff. On October 21, 2022, the parties filed an agreement. Due to the agreement, the administrative law judge lifts the abatement of this proceeding. Additionally, the ALJ grants the October 21, 2022 joint motion and admits the following evidence into the record of this proceeding:

1. The notice of violation and report to the Commission filed on December 8, 2021;
2. Commission Staff's petition to determine a violation and impose an administrative penalty filed on December 8, 2021;
3. Shell's request for a hearing filed on December 23, 2021;
4. The agreed motion to abate the proceeding pending settlement discussions filed on January 7, 2022; and
5. The agreement, including all attachments and confidential attachments, filed on October 21, 2022.
