### COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On December 15, 2021, Quadvest, LP (Quadvest) filed an application to amend its certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) in Harris and Montgomery Counties. Quadvest holds water CCN number 11612 and sewer CCN number 20952. Quadvest seeks to add approximately 185 acres of uncertificated area. Quadvest filed supplemental information on December 30, 2021

On December 20, 2021, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of January 18, 2022 for the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file a recommendation on the sufficiency of the application, notice and propose a procedural schedule.

### I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information and, as detailed in the attached memoranda from Patricia Garcia, Infrastructure Division, and Fred Bednarski, Rate Regulation Division, recommends that the application is administratively complete. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a comment on the merits of the application.

#### II. NOTICE

At this time, Staff recommends that Quadvest proceed with providing public notice to all landowners, neighboring utilities, political subdivisions, and other persons listed in the attached memorandum using the notice form provided by Ms. Garcia. Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that Quadvest provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area. Staff further recommends that Quadvest publish notice of the application for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Harris and Montgomery Counties. Once notice has been provided, Staff recommends that Quadvest file proof of notice as described in the attached memorandum, including an affidavit specifying the name and address of every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and a copy of the map provided with the notice. Quadvest should also provide a completed publisher's affidavit and a copy of the newspaper tear sheets demonstrating publication. Finally, Staff recommends that Quadvest use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

### **III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

Staff recommends the application be found administratively complete. Staff therefore proposes the following procedural schedule:

### **IV. CONCLUSION**

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that Quadvest be directed to provide notice as described in Ms. Garcia's attached memorandum, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an order consistent with these recommendations.

On December 15, 2021, Quadvest, LP (Quadvest) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 11612 and sewer CCN No. 20952 in Harris and Montgomery Counties, Texas under Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 through 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 through 24.237.

Based on the mapping review by Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, maps and digital data submitted with Item 2 on December 15, 2021 are sufficient. The application indicates that the total acreage being requested is approximately 186 acres. Ms. Montes determined the requested area is approximately 185 acres as described below.

The requested area includes 450 customer connections and approximately 185 acres, comprised of:

181 acres of uncertificated area; and

4 acres of decertified area from CCN Nos. 11612 and 20952.

The application proposes the subtraction of approximately 4 acres from CCN Nos. 11612 and 20952 and the addition of approximately 181 acres to CCN Nos. 11612 and 20952.

Based on my technical and managerial review of the information filed by Quadvest, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. I further recommend that Quadvest be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
  - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:

- d. Each landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
- e. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

Addresses can be obtained by Quadvest from the Water Utility Database at <u>http://www.puc.texas.gov/watersearch</u>. District information and addresses can be obtained from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's (TCEQ) web site located at <u>https://www14.tceq.texas.gov/iwud/index.cfm</u>.

2) Publish notice once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in each county where the requested area is located. Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the notice was mailed, Quadvest must file an

affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.

- 3) Provide notice using the attached notice forms.
- 4) Provide a copy of the map(s) deemed sufficient during administrative review delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers.
- 5) File in the docket a copy of notice and the map(s) deemed sufficient during administrative review along with the signed affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and the publisher's affidavit and tear sheets for proof of newspaper publication.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to Quadvest. Quadvest will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond.

On December 15, 2021, Quadvest, LP filed an application to amend its water and sewer certificates of convenience and necessity in Harris and Montgomery Counties under Subchapter G of Texas Water Code Chapter 13.

We reviewed the answers provided to questions 28, 29, 30, and 31 of the application. We did not identify any deficiencies in those answers for purposes of determining whether the application is administratively complete. Therefore, we recommend that the Commission deem the application administratively complete from a financial perspective.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large-scale map, a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land, landowner's name, address, email address and fax number, if applicable.
