COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

On December 17, 2021, 3349 Land Group, LLC (3349 Land Group) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from the Manville Water Supply Corporation (Manville WSC) water certificate convenience and necessity (CCN) number 11144 under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). 3349 Land Group asserts that the land to be released is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Williamson County, which is a qualifying county.

On January 20, 2022, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 2, establishing a deadline of February 23, 2022, for the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to make a recommendation on final disposition. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. RECOMMENDATION ON FINAL DISPOSITION

Staff has reviewed 3349 Land Group's petition and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Pai Liu of the Infrastructure Division, recommends that the petition be approved. The maps, warranty deed, and affidavit submitted by Brent Jones, General Partner of 3349 Land Group satisfies the requirements of TWC § 13.2541(b) and 16 TAC § 24.245(h). Specifically, the petition shows that the property for which 3349 Land Group seeks streamlined expedited release is (i) at least 25 acres in size; (ii) not receiving water or sewer service from Manville WSC; (iii) located within a qualifying county; and wholly owned by 3349 Land Group. The final water CCN map and water certificate are attached to this filing. Accordingly, Staff recommends that the petition for streamlined expedited release be approved.

II. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the petition be approved and entry of an order consistent with the above recommendations.


On December 17, 2021, 3349 Land Group, LLC (3349 Land Group) filed a petition for streamlined expedited release from Manville Water Supply Corporation's (Manville WSC) water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) No. 11144 in Williamson County, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(b) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(h). 3349 Land Group asserts that the land is at least 25 contiguous acres, is not receiving water service, and is located in Williamson County, which is a qualifying county.

3349 Land Group provided a warranty deed confirming ownership of the tract of land within Manville WSC's certificated service area. In addition, 3349 Land Group submitted a sworn affidavit attesting that the tract of land was not receiving water/sewer service from the CCN holder. Manville WSC requested to intervene.

Based on the mapping review by Gary Horton, Infrastructure Division, it was determined the landowner's total property is approximately 121 acres. The tract of land in the petition for streamlined expedited release is approximately 114 acres, of which approximately 114 acres overlap Manville WSC (CCN No. 11144) and would be decertified from CCN No. 11144.

In accordance with TWC § 13.2541 and 16 TAC § 24.245(h), 3349 Land Group has met the Commission's requirements to allow for the release of the tract of land from Manville WSC's CCN No. 11144. Therefore, I recommend approval of the petition. Enclosed is a final map and certificate for Commission approval.

Additionally, I recommend that a final map and certificate be provided to the CCN holder.
