Effective November 1, 2006 the Holiday Harbor – Gold Coast Community Water Supply will increase rates. This is due to increasing TCEQ testing fees and operational cost. New rates are as follows:

In case of an emergency condition due to equipment failure or very high usage of water placing undue stress and strain on equipment, the maintenance committee by a majority vote, or the water works operator provided a decision must be made immediately, may place restrictions on the use of water. This could be in the form of curtailing the use of water except for normal household and sanitary purposes or restrict the use of water for upkeep of lawns, shrubs and ect.

Each customer shall be notified by telephone or in person,

of any restriction imposed.

Violators will be subject to having their service disconnected

until the restriction or useage has been removed.

Any tampering with equipment of turning water on will result in service connection being removed and a charge of \$25.00 (connection charge) will be made to reconnect service, payable in advance, after the restriction on useage has been removed.

### DROUGHT CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR THE

## Holiday Harbor - Gold Coast Community Water Supply Corporation

### Section I: Declaration of Policy, Purpose, and Intent

In order to conserve the available water supply and protect the integrity of water supply facilities, with particular regard for domestic water use, sanitation, and fire protection, and to protect and preserve public health, welfare, and safety and minimize the adverse impacts of water supply shortage or other water supply emergency conditions, the Holiday Harbor - Gold Coast Community Water Supply Corporation ("HH-GC CWSC") hereby adopts the following regulations and restrictions on the delivery and consumption of water.

Water uses regulated or prohibited under this Drought Contingency Plan (the "Plan") are considered to be non-essential and continuation of such uses during times of water shortage or other emergency water supply condition are deemed to constitute a waste of water which subjects the offender(s) to penalties as defined in Section X of this Plan.

### **Section II: Public Involvement**

Opportunity for the public to provide input into the preparation of the Plan was provided by the HH-GC CWSC by means of public meeting.

### Section III: Public Education

The HH-GC CWSC will periodically provide the public with information about the Plan, including information about the conditions under which each stage of the Plan is to be initiated or terminated and the drought response measures to be implemented in each stage. This information will be provided by means of direct mail or utility bill inserts, as required by exigency.

### Section IV: Coordination with Regional Water Planning Groups

The service area of the HH-GC CWSC is located within the Northeastn Texas Rural Water Association and HH-GC CWSC has provided a copy of this Plan to the Northeast Texas Rural Water Association.

### Section V: Authorization

The Water Manager, or his/her designee, is hereby authorized and directed to implement the applicable provisions of this Plan upon determination that such implementation is necessary to protect public health, safety, and welfare. The Water Manager, or his/her designee, shall have the authority to initiate or terminate drought or other water supply emergency response measures as described in this Plan.

### Section VI: Application

The provisions of this Plan shall apply to all persons, customers, and property utilizing water provided by the HH-GC CWSC. The terms "person" and "customer" as used in the Plan include individuals, corporations, partnerships, associations, and all other legal entities.

### Section VII: Definitions

For the purposes of this Plan, the following definitions shall apply:

<u>Aesthetic water use</u>: water use for ornamental or decorative purposes such as fountains, reflecting pools, and water gardens.

Commercial and institutional water use: water use which is integral to the operations of commercial and non-profit establishments and governmental entities such as retail establishments, hotels and motels, restaurants, and office buildings.

<u>Conservation</u>: those practices, techniques, and technologies that reduce the consumption of water, reduce the loss or waste of water, improve the efficiency in the use of water or increase the recycling and reuse of water so that a supply is conserved and made available for future or alternative uses.

Customer: any person, company, or organization using water supplied by HH-GC CWSC.

<u>Domestic water use</u>: water use for personal needs or for household or sanitary purposes such as drinking, bathing, heating, cooking, sanitation, or for cleaning a residence, business, industry, or institution.

Even number address: street addresses, box numbers, or rural postal route numbers ending in 0, 2, 4, 6, or 8 and locations without addresses.

<u>Industrial water use</u>: the use of water in processes designed to convert materials of lower value into forms having greater usability and value.

<u>Landscape irrigation use</u>: water used for the irrigation and maintenance of landscaped areas, whether publicly or privately owned, including residential and commercial lawns, gardens, golf courses, parks, and rights-of-way and medians.

Non-essential water use: water uses that are not essential nor required for the protection of public, health, safety, and welfare, including:

- (a) irrigation of landscape areas, including parks, athletic fields, and golf courses, except otherwise provided under this Plan;
- (b) use of water to wash any motor vehicle, motorbike, boat, trailer, airplane or other vehicle:
- (c) use of water to wash down any sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking lots, tennis courts, or other hard-surfaced areas;
- (d) use of water to wash down buildings or structures for purposes other than immediate fire protection;
- (e) flushing gutters or permitting water to run or accumulate in any gutter or street;
- (f) use of water to fill, refill, or add to any indoor or outdoor swimming pools or jacuzzitype pools;
- (g) use of water in a fountain or pond for aesthetic or scenic purposes except where necessary to support aquatic life;
- (h) failure to repair a controllable leak(s) within a reasonable period after having been given notice directing the repair of such leak(s); and
- (i) use of water from hydrants for construction purposes or any other purposes other than fire fighting.

Odd numbered address: street addresses, box numbers, or rural postal route numbers ending in 1, 3, 5, 7, or 9.

### Section VIII: Criteria for Initiation and Termination of Drought Response Stages

The Water Manager, or his/her designee shall monitor water supply and/or demand conditions on a daily basis and shall determine when conditions warrant initiation or termination of each stage of the Plan, that is, when the specified "triggers" are reached.

The triggering criteria described below are based on drought, well capacity, pumping capacity, major equipment failure, and system contamination:

### Stage 1 Triggers -- MILD Water Shortage Conditions

### Requirements for initiation

Customers shall be requested to voluntarily conserve water and adhere to the prescribed restrictions on certain water uses, defined in Section VII + Definitions, when one or more triggers are exceeded. (See examples below):

Example 1: Annually, beginning on May 1 through September 30. Example 2: When the static level of well falls 30 foot below normal.

Example 3: When the well pump runs twelve (12) or more hours in a 24-hour period.

Example 4: When demand exceeds 70% of well pump capacity.

### Requirements for termination

Stage 1 of the Plan may be rescinded when all of the conditions listed as triggering events have ceased to exist for a period of three (3) consecutive days.

### Stage 2 Triggers -- MODERATE Water Shortage Conditions

### Requirements for initiation

Customers shall be required to comply with the requirements and restrictions on certain nonessential water uses provided in Section IX of this Plan when Stage 1 triggers one (1) and two (2) are exceeded for three (3) consecutive days.

### Requirements for termination

Stage 2 of the Plan may be rescinded when all of the conditions listed as triggering events have ceased to exist for a period of three (3) consecutive days. Upon termination of Stage 2, Stage 1 becomes operative.

### Stage 3 Triggers -- SEVERE Water Shortage Conditions

### Requirements for initiation

Customers shall be required to comply with the requirements and restrictions on certain non-essential water uses for Stage 3 of this Plan when Stage 1 triggers one (1), two (2), and three (3) are exceeded for three (3) days.

### Requirements for termination

Stage 3 of the Plan may be rescinded when all of the conditions listed as triggering events have ceased to exist for a period of three (3) consecutive days. Upon termination of Stage 3, Stage 2 becomes operative.

### Stage 4 Triggers -- CRITICAL Water Shortage Conditions

### Requirements for initiation

Customers shall be required to comply with the requirements and restrictions on certain nonessential water uses for Stage 4 of this Plan when Stage 1 triggers one (1), two (2), three (3), and four (4) are exceeded for three (3) days.

### Requirements for termination

Stage 4 of the Plan may be rescinded when all of the conditions listed as triggering events have ceased to exist for a period of three (3) consecutive days. Upon termination of Stage 4, Stage 3 becomes operative.

### Stage 5 Triggers -- EMERGENCY Water Shortage Conditions

### Requirements for initiation

Customers shall be required to comply with the requirements and restrictions for Stage 5 of this Plan when Water Manager, or his/her designee, determines that a water supply emergency exists based on:

- 1. Major water line breaks, or pump or system failures occur, which cause unprecedented loss of capability to provide water service; or
- 2. Natural or man-made contamination of the water supply source(s).

### Requirements for termination

Stage 5 of the Plan may be rescinded when all of the conditions listed as triggering events have ceased to exist for a period of three (3) consecutive days.

### Stage 6 Triggers -- WATER ALLOCATION

### Requirements for initiation

Customers shall be required to comply with the water allocation plan prescribed in Section IX of this Plan and comply with the requirements and restrictions for Stage 5 of this Plan when Stage 1 triggers one (1), two (2), three (3), and (4) are exceeded; Water Manager may implement water allocation if he/she deems it necessary.

<u>Requirements for termination</u> - Water allocation may be rescinded when all of the conditions listed as triggering events have ceased to exist for a period of three (3) consecutive days.

### Section IX: Drought Response Stages

The Water Manager, or his/her designee, shall monitor water supply and/or demand conditions on a daily basis and, in accordance with the triggering criteria set forth in Section VIII of this Plan, shall determine that a mild, moderate, severe, critical, emergency or water shortage condition exists and shall implement the following notification procedures:

#### **Notification**

### Notification of the Public:

The Water Manager, or his/ her designee shall notify the public by means of direct mail to each customer.

### Additional Notification:

The Water Manager, or his/ her designee shall notify directly, or cause to be notified directly, the following individuals and entities:

- (a) Cognizant fire chief(s)
- (b) TNRCC
- (c) Major water users.

### Stage 1 Response -- MILD Water Shortage Conditions

#### Goal:

Achieve a voluntary ten percent (10%) reduction in water usage on a voluntary basis.

### Supply Management Measures:

Daily monitoring of water demand.

### Voluntary Water Use Restrictions:

(a) Water customers are requested to voluntarily limit the irrigation of landscaped areas to Sundays and Thursdays for customers with a street address ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 or 8), and Saturdays and Wednesdays for water customers with a street address ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 or 9), and to irrigate landscapes only between the hours of midnight and 10:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m to midnight on designated watering days.

- (b) All operations of the HH-GC CWSC shall adhere to water use restrictions prescribed for Stage 2 of the Plan.
- (c) Water customers are requested to practice water conservation and to minimize or discontinue water use for non-essential purposes.

### Stage 2 Response -- MODERATE Water Shortage Conditions

### Goal:

Achieve a twenty percent (20%) reduction in water usage.

### Supply Management Measures:

Daily monitoring of water demand, and supply.l

#### Water Use Restrictions.

Under threat of penalty for violation, the following water use restrictions shall apply to all persons:

- (a) Irrigation of landscaped areas with hose-end sprinklers or automatic irrigation systems shall be limited to Sundays and Thursdays for customers with a street address ending in an even number (0, 2, 4, 6 or 8), and Saturdays and Wednesdays for water customers with a street address ending in an odd number (1, 3, 5, 7 or 9), and irrigation of landscaped areas is further limited to the hours of 12:00 midnight until 10:00 a.m. and between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight on designated watering days. However, irrigation of landscaped areas is permitted at anytime if it is by means of a hand-held hose, a faucet filled bucket or watering can of five (5) gallons or less, or drip irrigation system.
- (b) Use of water to wash any motor vehicle, motorbike, boat, trailer, airplane or other vehicle is prohibited except on designated watering days between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m. and between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight. Such washing, when allowed, shall be done with a hand-held bucket or a hand-held hose equipped with a positive shutoff nozzle for quick rises. Vehicle washing may be done at any time on the immediate premises of a commercial car wash or commercial service station. Further, such washing may be exempted from these regulations if the health, safety, and welfare of the public is contingent upon frequent vehicle cleansing, such as garbage trucks and vehicles used to transport food and perishables.

- (c) Use of water to fill, refill, or add to any indoor or outdoor swimming pools, wading pools, or jacuzzi-type pools is prohibited except on designated watering days between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m. and between 8 p.m. and 12:00 midnight.
- (d) Operation of any ornamental fountain or pond for aesthetic or scenic purposes is prohibited except where necessary to support aquatic life or where such fountains or ponds are equipped with a recirculation system.
- (e) Use of water from hydrants shall be limited to fire fighting, related activities, or other activities necessary to maintain public health, safety, and welfare, except that use of water from designated fire hydrants for construction purposes may be allowed under special permit from the HH-GC CWSC.
- (f) Use of water for the irrigation of golf course greens, tees, and fairways is prohibited except on designated watering days between the hours 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m. and between 8 p.m. and 12:00 midnight. However, if the golf course utilizes a water source other than that provided by the HH-GC CWSC, the facility shall not be subject to these regulations.
- (g) All restaurants are prohibited from serving water to patrons except upon request of the patron.
- (h) The following uses of water are defined as non-essential and are prohibited:
  - 1. wash down of any sidewalks, walkways, driveways, parking lots, tennis courts, or other hard-surfaced areas:
  - 2. use of water to wash down buildings or structures for purposes other than immediate fire protection;
  - 3. use of water for dust control;
  - 4. flushing gutters or permitting water to run or accumulate in any gutter or street; and
  - 5. failure to repair a controllable leak(s) within a reasonable period after having been given notice directing the repair of such leak(s).

### Stage 3 Response -- SEVERE Water Shortage Conditions

### Goal:

Achieve a thirty percent (30%) reduction in water usage.

### Supply Management Measures:

- (a) Reduce flushing of mains.
- (b) Delete monthly minimum usage. Customer to pay for every thousand gallons of water at regular block rates.

### Water Use Restrictions.

All requirements of Stage 2 shall remain in effect during Stage 3 except:

- (a) Irrigation of landscaped areas shall be limited to designated watering days between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m. and between 8 p.m. and 12:00 midnight and shall be by means of hand-held hoses, hand-held buckets, drip irrigation, or permanently installed automatic sprinkler system only. The use of hose-end sprinklers is prohibited at all times.
- (b) The use of water for construction purposes from designated fire hydrants under special permit is to be discontinued.

### Stage 4 Response -- CRITICAL Water Shortage Conditions

Goal:

Achieve a forty percent (40%) reduction in water usage.

### Supply Management Measures:

- (a) No flushing of mains.
- (b) Daily monitoring of water demand and supply.
- (c) Notification to customers that allocation may be necessary.

### Water Use Restrictions.

All requirements of Stage 2 and 3 shall remain in effect during Stage 4 except:

(a) Irrigation of landscaped areas shall be limited to designated watering days between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. and between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 midnight and shall

be by means of hand-held hoses, hand-held buckets, or drip irrigation only. The use of hose-end sprinklers or permanently installed automatic sprinkler systems are prohibited at all times.

- (b) Use of water to wash any motor vehicle, motorbike, boat, trailer, airplane or other vehicle not occurring on the premises of a commercial car wash and commercial service stations and not in the immediate interest of public health, safety, and welfare is prohibited. Further, such vehicle washing at commercial car washes and commercial service stations shall occur only between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. and between 6:00 p.m. and 10 p.m.
- (c) The filling, refilling, or adding of water to swimming pools, wading pools, and jacuzzi-type pools is prohibited.
- (d) Operation of any ornamental fountain or pond for aesthetic or scenic purposes is prohibited except where necessary to support aquatic life or where such fountains or ponds are equipped with a recirculation system.
- (e) No application for new, additional, expanded, or increased-in-size water service connections, meters, service lines, pipeline extensions, mains, or water service facilities of any kind shall be approved, and time limits for approval of such applications are hereby suspended for such time as this drought response stage or a higher-numbered stage shall be in effect.

### Stage 5 Response -- EMERGENCY Water Shortage Conditions

Goal:

Achieve a fifty percent (50%) reduction in water usage.

### **Supply Management Measures:**

- (a) No flushing of mains.
- (b) Daily monitoring of water demand and supply.
- (c) Monitoring to see that restrictions are being adhered to.

### Water Use Restrictions.

All requirements of Stage 2, 3, and 4 shall remain in effect during Stage 5 except:

- (a) Irrigation of landscaped areas is absolutely prohibited.
- (b) Use of water to wash any motor vehicle, motorbike, boat, trailer, airplane or other vehicle is absolutely prohibited.

### Stage 6 Response -- WATER ALLOCATION

In the event that water shortage conditions threaten public health, safety, and welfare, the Water Manager is hereby authorized to allocate water according to the following water allocation plan:

### **Single-Family Residential Customers**

The allocation to residential water customers residing in a single-family dwelling shall be as follows:

Persons per Household	Gallons per Month
1 or 2	6,000
3 or 4	7,000
5 or 6	8,000
7 or 8	9,000
9 or 10	10,000
11 or more	12,000

"Household" means the residential premises served by the customer's meter. "Persons per household" includes only those persons currently physically residing at the premises and expected to reside there for the entire billing period. It shall be assumed that a particular customer's household is comprised of two (2) persons unless the customer notifies the HH-GC CWSC of a greater number of persons per household on a form prescribed by the Water Manager,. The Water Manager shall give his/her best effort to see that such forms are mailed, otherwise provided, or made available to every residential customer. If, however, a customer does not receive such a form, it shall be the customer's responsibility to go to the HH-GC CWSC offices to complete and sign the form claiming more than two (2) persons per household. New customers may claim more persons per household at the time of applying for water service on the form prescribed by the Water Manager. When the number of persons per household increases so as to place the customer in a different allocation category, the

customer may notify the HH-GC CWSC on such form and the change will be implemented in the next practicable billing period. If the number of persons in a household is reduced, the customer shall notify the HH-GC CWSC in writing within two (2) days. In prescribing the method for claiming more than two (2) persons per household, the Water Manager, shall adopt methods to insure the accuracy of the claim. Any person who knowingly, recklessly, or with criminal negligence falsely reports the number of persons in a household or fails to timely notify the HH-GC CWSC of a reduction in the number of person in a household shall be fined not less than \$50.00.

Residential water customers shall pay the following surcharges:

- \$ 2.00 for the first 1,000 gallons over allocation.
- \$ 3.00 for the second 1,000 gallons over allocation.
- \$ 4.00 for the third 1,000 gallons over allocation.
- \$ 5.00 for each additional 1,000 gallons over allocation.

Surcharges shall be cumulative.

### Section X: Enforcement

- (a) No person shall knowingly or intentionally allow the use of water from the HH-GC CWSC for residential, commercial, industrial, agricultural, governmental, or any other purpose in a manner contrary to any provision of this Plan, or in an amount in excess of that permitted by the drought response stage in effect at the time pursuant to action taken by the Water Manager, or his/her designee, in accordance with provisions of this Plan.
- (b) Any person who violates this Plan is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$ 50.00) and not more than seventy-five dollars (\$ 75.00). Each day that one or more of the provisions in this Plan is violated shall constitute a separate offense. If a person is convicted of three or more distinct violations of this Plan, the Water Manager, shall, upon due notice to the customer, be authorized to discontinue water service to the premises where such violations occur. Services discontinued under such circumstances shall be restored only upon payment of a re-connection charge, hereby established at \$ 25.00, and any other costs incurred by the HH-GC CWSC in discontinuing service. In addition, suitable assurance must be given to the water Manager that the same action shall not be repeated while the Plan is in effect. Compliance with this plan may also be sought through injunctive relief in the district court.
- (c) Any person, including a person classified as a water customer of the HH-GC CWSC, in apparent control of the property where a violation occurs or originates shall be presumed to

be the violator, and proof that the violation occurred on the person's property shall constitute a rebuttable presumption that the person in apparent control of the property committed the violation, but any such person shall have the right to show that he/she did not commit the violation. Parents shall be presumed to be responsible for violations of their minor children and proof that a violation, committed by a child, occurred on property within the parents' control shall constitute a rebuttable presumption that the parent committed the violation, but any such parent may be excused if he/she proves that he/she had previously directed the child not to use the water as it was used in violation of this Plan and that the parent could not have reasonably known of the violation.

### Section XI: Variances

The Water Manager, or his/her designee, may, in writing, grant temporary variance for existing water uses otherwise prohibited under this Plan if it is determined that failure to grant such variance would cause an emergency condition adversely affecting the health, sanitation, or fire protection for the public or the person requesting such variance and if one or more of the following conditions are met:

- (a) Compliance with this Plan cannot be technically accomplished during the duration of the water supply shortage or other condition for which the Plan is in effect.
- (b) Alternative methods can be implemented which will achieve the same level of reduction in water use.

Persons requesting an exemption from the provisions of this Ordinance shall file a petition for variance with the HH-GC CWSC within 5 days after the Plan or a particular drought response stage has been invoked. All petitions for variances shall be reviewed by the Water Manager, or his/her designee, and shall include the following:

- (a) Name and address of the petitioner(s).
- (b) Purpose of water use.
- (c) Specific provision(s) of the Plan from which the petitioner is requesting relief.
- (d) Detailed statement as to how the specific provision of the Plan adversely affects the petitioner or what damage or harm will occur to the petitioner or others if petitioner complies with this Ordinance.
- (e) Description of the relief requested.
- (f) Period of time for which the variance is sought.
- (g) Alternative water use restrictions or other measures the petitioner is taking or proposes to take to meet the intent of this Plan and the compliance date.
- (h) Other pertinent information.

Variances granted by the HH-GC CWSC shall be subject to the following conditions, unless waived or modified by the Water Manager, or his/her designee:

- (a) Variances granted shall include a timetable for compliance.
- (b) Variances granted shall expire when the Plan is no longer in effect, unless the petitioner has failed to meet specified requirements.

No variance shall be retroactive or otherwise justify any violation of this Plan occurring prior to the issuance of the variance.





#### BY-LAWS

HOLIDAY HARBOR- GOLD COAST COMMUNITY WATER SUPPLY CORP.

BY-LAWS of the Holiday Harbor-Gold Coast Community Water Supply Corporation, having been presented to the Board of Directors of said Corporation and duly adolpted are as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

The Fresident shall preside at all Members and Director meetings. He may, and upon demand of one-third (1/3) of the Directors, call a special meeting of the directors or membership. Such special meetings shall be held upon giving the notice required in ARTICLE XII of these By- Laws. He shall preform all other duties that usually pretain to the office or are delegated to him by the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE II

The Vice president shall, in case of the absence or disability of the President, preform the duties of the President.

#### ARTICLE III

The Treasurer shall have custody of all the monies, and the secretary shall have custody of all the securtics of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall keep regular financial books. The Secretary shall keep minutes of allmeetings of members and directors. All monies of the Corporation shall be deposited in such depository as shall be selected by the directors. Checks must be signed by the Treasurer and the President, or in the absence of the President, they must be signed by the treasurer and the vice president. The Secretary shall have custody of the seal of the Corporation, and affix it as directed hereby or by resolutionpassed by the Board of Directors, or members in a regular meeting. The secretary and/or treasurer may, if so voted by a majority of members, be placed under fidelity—bond in an amount set by the Board of Directors. The amount of the bond shall be set from time to time by the Board, but shall not be less than \$1,000.

#### ARTICLE IV

The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three nor more than twenty-one people, which is always the full Board of Directors of Holiday Properties Tymers Association, as elected and serving in that capacity in that Association. (Aug. 29, 1970)

#### ARTICLE V

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such time and place as the Board may determine at the next previous regular meeting. No futher notice to the Directors of such regular meetings shall be determined, and it shall be the duty of each director to attend the same without further notice. (Aug. 29, 1970).

#### ARTICLE VI.

The Corporation shall conduct it's business on a non-profit basis, and no dividends shall ever be paid upon the memberships of such Corporation. All profits arising from the operation of such business shall be annually paid out to the personswho have, during the past year, transacted business with such Corporation, in direct proportion to the amount of business transacted, provided that no such dividends shall ever be paid while any indebtiness of the Corporation remains unpaid. The Corporation may issue water bonds in principle amounts, interest rates and maturity dates as the Board of Directors shall determine.

### ARTICLE VII

The Board of Directors shall establish and maintain priority as to; the indebtiness of the Corporation to the bondholders. Six percent interest per annum shall be paid on all bonds (15 year bonds, recalled by vote of the Board as feasible).

### ARTICLE VIII

Bonds in the Corporation shall be sold for \$100.00 each, to property owners of Holiday Harbor- Gold Coast. The property owner may own more than one bond (amaximum of ten), but entitled to only one vote in the . Corporation.

#### ARTICIL IX

For the purpose of determining members entitled to notice of, or to vote at, any meeting of members or any adjournment thereof, or in order to make a determination of members for any other proper purpose, ownership of property shall be deemed toobe the means of determining who are members in Holiday Properties Owners Association. (Aug. 26, 1978) Proposed change.

#### Article X

There shall be a regular meeting of the members annually to transact all business that may be properly brought before it. The annual meeting will be the same meeting as the Holiday Properties Owners Association annual meeting.

### ARTICLE XI

Special meetings of the directors and members may be held with the priter consent of such one-third directors, and/ormembers, respectively, the president shall request in writing that the Secretary give ten (10) days notice to such directors and/or members. Such notice shall indicate the time, place, and purpose of the meeting, and shall be addressed and mailed to such individuals at their addresses last known to the Corporation.

### ARTICLE XII

The business of the Corporation may be handled under the direction of the Board of Directors, or by the manager to be elected by a majority

vote of the Board and he/ she shall serve with or without compensation. The manager, with the approval of the Board of Directors, may employ, with or without compensation such supervisory, clerical or other employees as he/she may require to effectively operate the business of the Corporation.

#### ARTICLE XIII

All members will be billed for water charges on the last day of each month and bills shall be due by the fifteenth (15) of the following month. If payment is not made by the 15th, a member will be billed again and if payment is not made within five(5) days of the second billing, service will be disconnected. A charge of \$10.00 will be made to reconnect the service, after the reconnect bill and the past due charge has been paid. (Article changed and passed at the annual meeting Aug. 27, 1977)

### ARTICLE XIV

The books and accounts of the Corporation shall be audited by persons competent to preform such audit at least once each year. Yhe reports prepared by such auditors shall be submitted to the members at the annual meeting of such members.

#### ARTICLE XV

These By- Laws may be altered, amended, or repealed by a vote of a majority of the members present at any regular meeting of the Corporation called for that purpose, except that the members shall not have the power to change the purposes of the Corporation so as to decrease it's rights and powers under the laws of the State, or to waive any requirements of bond or other provision for the safety and security of the property and funds of the Corporation or it's members, or to deprive any member of rights or privilegesthen existing, or so to amend the By-Laws as to effect a fundamental change in the policies of the Corporation. Notice of any amendment to be made at a special meeting of the members must be given at least ten (10) days before such meeting and must set forth the amendments to be considered.

### ARTICLE XVI

The seal of the Corporation shall consist of a circle within which shall be inscribed "HOLIDAY HARBOR- GOLD COAST COMMUNITY WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION".

The Corporation shall be a non-profit Corporation organized under Article 1434a of Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes, as amended. supplemented by the Texas Non-profit Corporation Act, Article 1396 1.01 et seq., Vernon's Annotated Civil Scatutes as amended, and is authorized to exercise all powers, privileges and rights conferred on a Corporation by these Acts, and all powers and rights incidental in carrying out the purposes for which the Corporation is formed, except such as are inconsistent with the express provisions of these Acts and By-Laws of the Corporation.

#### ARTICLE III

The period of its duration is perpetual.

The Corporation is formed for the purpose of furnishing a water supply for general use and domestic purposes to individuals residing in the community known as Holiday Harbor and Gold Coast Section of
