**ORDER NO. 2**  
**CERTIFYING ELIGIBILITY AND FINDING APPLICANT’S**  
**REQUESTED NAME DISTINCTIVE AND ACCEPTABLE**

This Order addresses Draupnir Infrastructure Group, LLC’s eligibility to obtain a service provider certificate of operating authority (COA) and acceptability of its requested name. On February 22, 2022, Commission Staff filed recommendations on the applicant’s eligibility to obtain a COA and acceptability of its requested name.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds Draupnir Infrastructure Group, LLC eligible to obtain a COA under PURA<sup>1</sup> § 54.153. Additionally, the ALJ finds the applicant’s requested name, “Draupnir Infrastructure Group, LLC” to be distinctive and acceptable under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 26.111(h).
