ORDER NO. 4 GRANTING MOTION TO INTERVENE

This Order addresses Broad Reach Power LLC's March 7, 2022 motion to intervene in this proceeding. Broad Reach Power states that it currently has four battery energy storage systems in operation at distribution level in AEP Texas Inc.'s service area. The facilities are interconnected to AEP Texas and receive wholesale transmission service at distribution voltage, which would be assessed charges under AEP Texas's proposed application. For this reason, Broad Reach Power has presented a justiciable interest that may be affected by the outcome of this proceeding. No party filed an objection to Broad Reach Power's motion to intervene. Accordingly, the administrative law judge grants Broad Reach Power's motion to intervene.

For service of pleadings, the service list in this proceeding is available from the Public Utility Commission of Texas by emailing Docket Management at <u>CADMOrders@puc.texas.gov</u> and requesting a copy of the service list in Docket No. 53267. Service of pleadings is typically governed by 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.74. Accordingly, a filing party must provide notice by e-mail of any pleading or document filed. It will be incumbent upon all other parties to obtain a copy of the pleading or document by accessing the Interchange.

All parties must provide their current address, **e-mail address**, telephone and fax numbers, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such information. Each party must provide the Commission and all parties with updated address, **e-mail address**, telephone, and fax information if such information changes. **The e-mail addresses**,

telephone and fax numbers will be placed on the service list for the convenience of the parties. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of any other parties.

Filing of pleadings is typically governed by 16 TAC § 22.71. However, the Commission's Second Order Suspending Rules suspended certain filing requirements found in 16 TAC § 22.71. As long as the Second Order Suspending Rules remains in effect, all parties must file any pleading or document with the Commission solely through the Interchange on the Commission's website (https://interchange.puc.texas.gov/filer) and provide notice, by e-mail, to all other parties that the pleading or document has been filed with the Commission, unless otherwise ordered by the presiding officer. It will be incumbent upon all other parties to obtain a copy of the pleading or document by accessing the Interchange.
