COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On March 10, 2022, Stonebridge Water Supply Corporation (Stonebridge WSC) and Cross Timbers Water Supply Corporation (Cross Timbers WSC) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for approval of the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Denton County. Specifically, Cross Timbers WSC seeks approval to acquire facilities and to transfer all of the water service area from Stonebridge WSC's water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12415 to Cross Timbers WSC's water CCN No. 10197. The Applicants also are seeking cancellation of Stonebridge WSC's water CCN No. 12415. The Applicants filed supplemental information on March 17 and April 5, 2022.

On March 11, 2022, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 1, establishing a deadline of April 8, 2022 for the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice, and to propose a procedural schedule for the further processing of this docket. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Fred Bednarski III of the Commission's Rate Regulation Division, recommends that the application is administratively complete from a financial perspective. However, as detailed in the attached memorandum from James Harville of the Commission's Infrastructure Division, Staff recommends that the application is administratively incomplete from a managerial and technical perspective. Staff respectfully requests that the Applicants be ordered to cure the deficiencies identified in Mr. Harville's memorandum by May 9, 2022, and that Staff be given a deadline of

June 9, 2022 to file a supplemental recommendation on administrative completeness. Staff notes that the Applicants should not issue notice until the application is found administratively complete.

II. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with Staff's deficiency recommendation, Staff does not propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the docket at this time. Staff intends to propose a procedural schedule alongside a subsequent recommendation that the application be found administratively complete.

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete and that the Applicants be ordered to file supplemental information to cure the deficiencies in the application by May 9, 2022. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an order consistent with these recommendations.

On March 10, 2022, Cross Timbers Water Supply Corporation (Cross Timbers WSC) and Stonebridge Water Supply Corporation (Stonebridge WSC) (collectively, Applicants) filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Denton County, Texas, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.301 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.239.

Specifically, Cross Timbers WSC, Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10197, seeks approval to acquire facilities and to transfer all of the water service area from Stonebridge WSC under water CCN No. 12415.

Based on the mapping review by Dave Babicki, Infrastructure Division, and my technical and managerial review of the information filed by the Applicants, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively incomplete and not accepted for filing due to the deficiencies detailed below.

Application Content

The following deficiencies must be remedied:

1. Customer Deposits

The Applicants indicated that a list of customer deposits was included with the application, as required by Part B, Question 5,¹ but no such list of customers was filed with the application. Please clarify whether customers with deposits are present. If customers with deposits are present, please file a supplemental attachment listing such customers, including a customer

indicator (name or account number), date of each deposit, amount of each deposit, and any unpaid interest on each deposit.

2. Compliance

Please provide a copy of the most recent Texas Commission on Environmental Quality comprehensive compliance investigation for Stonebridge WSC.

Mapping Content

Maps submitted with Item 1 on March 10, 2022 are deficient.

The Applicants must submit the following items to resolve the mapping deficiencies:

- A general location map identifying only the requested area, in reference to the nearest county boundary, city, or town;
- A detailed map identifying only the requested area, in reference to verifiable man-made and natural landmarks, such as roads, rivers, and railroads; and
- Digital mapping data for the requested area, as a single polygon record, in shapefile (SHP) format, georeferenced in either NAD83 Texas Statewide Mapping System (Meters) or NAD83 Texas State Plane Coordinate System (US Feet).

Staff recommends that the Applicants obtain additional mapping guidance from the Commission's mapping staff, specifically Dave Babicki, by email at dave.babicki@puc.texas.gov to resolve the mapping deficiencies.

Staff will need at least 30 days to review the supplemental documentation, maps, and digital data provided by the Applicants and draft a recommendation.
