COMPLAINT OF ENGIE ENERGY MARKETING NA, INC. AND VIRDITY ENERGY SOLUTIONS, INC. AGAINST THE ELECTRIC RELIABILITY COUNCIL OF TEXAS, INC.

SOAH ORDER NO. 1

FILING DESCRIPTION, SETTING PREHEARING CONFERENCE,
AND GENERAL PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

I. FILING DESCRIPTION

On March 18, 2022, ENGIE Energy Marketing NA, Inc. and Viridity Energy Solutions, Inc. (jointly, Complainants) filed a complaint with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) against the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, Inc. (ERCOT). After the Commission, on interim appeal, overturned the Commission ALJ's finding of administrative completeness, an Amended Complaint was filed on August 18, 2022. The amended complaint alleges that

ERCOT failed to compensate or credit Complainants for ancillary services complainants provided for several days during Winter Storm Uri in February 2021. Specifically, Viridity claims that it provided Responsive Reserve Service (RSS) without compensation and should be credited between \$67.4 million and \$140.55 million; ENGIE claims it was improperly charged \$47.7 million for failing to provide RRS as required and should be credited that amount. ERCOT disputes that Complainants are entitled to any compensation

The Commission issued an order on November 1, 2022, referring the case to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for assignment of an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) to conduct a hearing and issue a proposal for decision, if necessary. On November 3, 2022, the Commission issued a Preliminary Order identifying the issues that must be addressed in this proceeding, and several issues that should not be addressed.

SOAH has jurisdiction over matters relating to the conduct of the hearing in this proceeding pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2003.049.

II. NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE

A prehearing conference in this proceeding will be convened at 10:00 a.m. (Central Time) on November 22, 2022, via Zoom videoconference. Attend the prehearing conference in one of these ways:

At the prehearing conference, the following matters will be discussed:

1. Pending motions, if any;

2. The burden of proof;

3. Whether this case may be efficiently resolved in whole or in part through procedures such as stipulations or limitation of the scope of the hearing;

4. Whether the parties are interested in mediating this dispute;¹

5. A procedural schedule; and

6. Any other matters that may assist in the disposition of this case in a fair and efficient manner.

The parties should confer before the prehearing conference regarding the procedural schedule that will apply in this case. Any proposed procedural schedule must include, at a minimum, deadlines for discovery and prefiled testimony, three

alternative dates for the hearing on the merits,² and deadlines for post-hearing briefs.

If the parties are able to agree to a procedural schedule, they may file an agreed schedule by **no later than Friday, November 18, 2022,** which may include an agreed motion to cancel the prehearing conference. If such a motion is filed, the prehearing conference will be automatically canceled without further order by the ALJ.

III. GENERAL PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS

Due to COVID-19, the Commission has suspended certain rules and is requiring e-mail service and online filings.³ The Commission's procedural rules govern this case except as modified by the Commission or SOAH.⁴ All filings must contain both the SOAH and Commission docket numbers.

A motion seeking a continuance or extension of time **SHALL** propose a new date or dates and indicate whether the other parties agree to the new date or dates. Because the ALJ may not be available on a given day, proposing a range of dates is advisable. The ALJ will not contact parties to ascertain their position or to

negotiate dates. In the absence of a ruling by the ALJ, a motion is not granted and

the existing schedule remains in place. Unless otherwise specified in the

Commission's procedural rules or an order issued in this case, responses to a

motion or other pleading SHALL be filed within five working days from receipt of

the motion or pleading. If a party does not respond to a motion, the ALJ will

assume that the party agrees with the motion or does not oppose the requested

relief.

Routine procedural and logistical questions may be directed to the ALJ's

personnel may not provide advice or interpret orders or regulations for the parties.

The parties SHALL avoid unlawful ex parte communications with any SOAH

employee. If a party emails SOAH regarding this case (including an email to SOAH

support staff limited to logistical matters), the party SHALL copy all other parties

on that email.
