2023 EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN FILING


Pursuant to Texas Administrative Code ("TAC") § 25.53(c)(3)(B), House Mountain LLC ("House Mountain") hereby makes its annual Emergency Operations Plan filing.

As attested to in Andrew Bowman's affidavit attached as Exhibit A, no changes have been made to House Mountain's Emergency Operations Plan that materially affect how House Mountain would respond to an emergency since House Mountain's Emergency Operations Plan filing on September 14, 2022.

House Mountain has attached as Confidential Exhibit B an updated Emergency Contact Sheet. House Mountain notes that the primary and backup Public Utility Commission of Texas emergency contacts have not changed since House Mountain's Emergency Operations Plan filing on September 14, 2022 (as supplemented on September 14, 2022).

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

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BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared Andrew Bowman who swore an oath that the following facts are true:


1. My name is Andrew Bowman. I am the President of Jupiter Power LLC and the highest-ranking officer with binding authority over House Mountain LLC (“House Mountain”). I am over 18 years of age, of sound mind, and competent and authorized to make this affidavit on behalf of House Mountain. I have personal knowledge of the matters described herein.
2. House Mountain is registered with the Public Utility Commission of Texas as a power generation company and an indirect subsidiary of Jupiter Power LLC. The House Mountain facility is a battery energy storage system.
3. House Mountain filed an emergency operations plan (the “Plan”) in accordance with 16 Texas Administrative Code (“TAC”) § 25.53 on September 14, 2022.
4. An annual review of the Plan was completed on March 9, 2023, and no changes were made to the Plan that materially affect how House Mountain would respond to an emergency since House Mountain’s filing on September 14, 2022.
5. All relevant operating personnel are familiar with and have received training on the applicable contents and execution of the Plan, and such personnel are instructed to follow the applicable portions of the Plan except to the extent deviations are appropriate as a result of specific circumstances during the course of an emergency.
6. The Plan has been reviewed and approved by the appropriate executives.
7. House Mountain conducted a drill on November 16, 2022 in accordance with 16 TAC § 25.53(f).
8. The Plan or an appropriate summary has been distributed to local jurisdictions as needed.
9. House Mountain maintains a business continuity plan that addresses returning to normal operations after disruptions caused by an incident.
10. House Mountain’s emergency management personnel who are designated to interact with local, state, and federal emergency management officials during emergency events have received the latest IS-100, IS-200, IS-700, and IS-800 National Incident Management System training.
