

### JOINT PROPOSED NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice of Approval addresses the application of CSWR-Texas Utility Operating Company, LLC (CSWR-Texas) and Water Works I and II (Water Works) for the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Llano County. The Commission approves the following: (1) the sale and transfer of all facilities and service area held under Water Works' water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) number 11674 to CSWR-Texas; (2) the cancellation of Water Works' water CCN number 11674; and (3) the amendment of CSWR-Texas's water CCN number 13290 to include the area previously included in Water Works' water CCN number 11674.

### 1. Findings of Fact

The Commission makes the following findings of fact:

### **Applicants**

- 1. Water Works is an investor-owned utility that operates, maintains, and controls facilities for providing water service in Llano County under CCN number 11674.
- 2. Water Works holds CCN number 11674, which obligates it to provide retail water service in its certificated service area in Llano County.
- 3. Water Works owns and operates public water systems registered with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) under the names Water Works 1 Floyd Acres, public water system (PWS) ID No. 1500018 and Water Works 2 Island Lodges, PWS ID No. 1500019.
- CSWR-Texas is a Texas limited liability company registered with the Texas secretary of state under file number 0803367893.
- 5. CSWR-Texas is an investor-owned utility that operates, maintains, and controls facilities for providing water service in Angelina, Aransas, Austin, Brazoria, Burleson, Burnet, Calhoun, Camp, Denton, Ellis, Erath, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Harris, Hays, Hidalgo, Hood,

- Jackson, Kerr, Limestone, Llano, Lubbock, McCulloch, Medina, Montague, Montgomery, Navarro, Orange, Palo Pinto, Parker, Polk, Robertson, Sabine, San Augustine, Tarrant, Uvalde, Victoria, Wilson, and Wood counties under CCN number 13290.
- 6. CSWR-Texas owns multiple public water systems registered with the TCEQ.

### **Application**

- 7. On February 22, 2022, CSWR-Texas and Cody and Anita Lewis dba Cassie Water Company, Deer Springs Water Company, and Water Works filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Burnet and Llano Counties.
- In Order No. 1 filed on April 4, 2022, the ALJ severed the application into three dockets: Docket Nos 53259, 53429, and the present docket, which only includes CSWR-Texas and Water Works.
- 9. In the application, as severed, the Applicants seek approval of the following transaction: (a) CSWR-Texas will acquire all of Water Works' water facilities and water service area held under water CCN No. 11674; (b) Water Works' water CCN number 11674 will be canceled; and (c) CSWR-Texas's CCN number 13290 will be amended to include the area previously included in Water Works' CCN number 11674.
- 10. CSWR-Texas supplemented its application on April 5, 6, 19, and 28, May 9, and June 14 and 20, 2022.
- 11. The requested area includes 84 customer connections and approximately 137 acres.
- 12. The requested area (Water Works I) is located approximately 12.7 miles east of downtown Llano, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by Lake Buchanan; on the east by Lake Buchanan; on the south by State Highway 261; and on the west by State Highway 261.
- 13. The requested area (Water Works II) is located approximately 11.8 miles west of downtown Burnet, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by Lake Buchanan; on the east by Lake Buchanan; on the south by State Highway 29; and on the west by Lake Buchanan.
- 14. In Order No. 3, issued on May 9, 2022, the administrative law judge (ALJ) found the application, as supplemented, administratively complete.

### Notice

- 15. CSWR-Texas provided notice consistent with 16 TAC § 24.239(c). The deadline to intervene was July 22, 2022.
- On June 6, 2022, CSWR-Texas filed the affidavit of Aaron Silas, regulatory case manager of CSWR-Texas, attesting that notice was provided to all current customers, neighboring utilities, and affected parties on May 23, 2022.
- 17. In Order No. 4, issued on June 23, 2022, the ALJ found notice to be sufficient.

### Intervention

- 18. In Order No. 7 filed on July 12, 2022, the ALJ granted the motion to intervene filed by Mark Blankenship, limited to his capacity as a customer of Water Works.
- 19. On August 23, 2022, Mark Blankenship filed a request to withdraw his intervention.
- 20. In Order No. 9 filed on August 26, 2022, the ALJ granted Mr. Blankenship's request to withdraw his intervention and he was dismissed from this proceeding.

### Evidentiary Record

- 21. In Order No. 10 filed on August 30, 2022, the ALJ admitted the following evidence into the record: (a) the application, including confidential attachments, filed on February 22, 2022; (b) CSWR-Texas's supplements to the application, including all confidential attachments, filed on April 5, 6, 19, and 28, May 9, and June 14 and 20, 2022; (c) Commission Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness, filed on May 6, 2022; (d) CSWR-Texas's affidavit of notice to current customers, neighboring utilities, and affected parties, including confidential Exhibit B, filed on June 6, 2022; (e) CSWR-Texas's letter to ALJ regarding Proof of Notice, filed on June 17, 2022; (f) Commission Staff's recommendation on sufficiency of notice, filed on June 22, 2022; (g) CSWR-Texas's response to motion to intervene, filed on June 24, 2022; (h) Commission Staff's recommendation on the transaction, including confidential attachments, filed on July 29, 2022.
- 22. On April 5, 2024, the parties filed a joint supplemental motion to admit evidence.
- 23. On\_\_\_\_\_\_, in Order No. \_\_\_\_\_\_, the ALJ admitted the following evidence into the record: (a) the applicant's bill of sale and assignment, filed on January 5, 2024; (b) CSWR-Texas's affidavit regarding customer deposits, including confidential attachment, filed on January 18, 2024; (c) the applicants' supplemental closing documents, filed on January 22,

2024; (d) Commission Staff's recommendation on the sufficiency of closing documents, filed on February 6, 2024; (e) the applicants' consent forms, filed on March 14, 2024; and (f) the map, certificate, and tariff pages attached to the joint supplemental motion to admit evidence and proposed notice of approval, filed on April 5, 2024.

### Sale

- 24. In Order No. 11 filed on September 22, 2022, the ALJ approved the sale and transaction to proceed and required the applicants to file proof that the transaction had closed and that customer deposits had been addressed.
- On January 5, 2024, CSWR-Texas filed notice that the sale had closed on December 7, 2023, and by a filing on January 18, 2024, confirmed that there were no outstanding customer deposits that needed to be addressed.
- 26. In Order No. 18 filed on February 7, 2024, the ALJ found the closing documentation sufficient.

### Purchaser's Compliance History

- 27. CSWR-Texas has not been under enforcement action by the Commission, Texas Health and Human Services, the Office of the Texas Attorney General, or the United States Environmental Protection Agency in the past five years for non-compliance with rules, orders, or state statutes. CSWR-Texas has been under enforcement action by the TCEQ in the past five years.
- 28. CSWR-Texas does not have a history of continuing mismanagement or misuse of revenues as a utility service provider.
- 29. CSWR-Texas demonstrated a compliance history that is adequate for approval of the sale to proceed.

### Adequacy of Existing Service

- 30. There are currently 84 customer connections in the requested area that are being served by Water Works through PWS identification numbers 1500018 and 1500019, and service has been continuous and adequate.
- There is no evidence in the record that Water Works has failed to comply with any Commission or TCEQ order.

### **Need for Additional Service**

- 32. There is a continuing need for service because Water Works is currently serving 84 customer connections in the requested area.
- 33. The customers are currently receiving water service from Water Works' water systems.
- 34. This is an application to transfer only existing facilities, service area, and customers.
- 35. There is no evidence of specific requests for additional service within the requested area.

### Effect of Approving the Transaction and Granting the Amendment

- 36. CSWR-Texas will be the sole certificated water utility for the requested area.
- 37. CSWR-Texas will be required to provide continuous and adequate water service to current and future customers in the requested area.
- 38. Landowners in the requested area will be able to obtain water service from CSWR-Texas.
- 39. Because this application is to transfer only existing facilities, customers, and service area, there will be no effect on any retail public utility providing service in the proximate area.
- 40. There will be no effect on landowners in the requested area because the requested area is currently certificated.

### Ability to Serve: Managerial and Technical

- 41. CSWR-Texas owns and operates 34 public water systems registered with the TCEQ.
- 42. The Commission's complaint records, which date back to 2017, show 12 complaints against CSWR-Texas.
- 43. CSWR-Texas employs or contracts with TCEQ-licensed operators of public water systems who will operate the public water system being transferred.
- 44. No additional construction is necessary for CSWR-Texas to provide service to the requested area.
- 45. CSWR-Texas has access to an adequate supply of water and is capable of providing drinking water that meets the requirements of chapter 341 of Texas Health and Safety Code, chapter 13 of the Texas Water Code (TWC), and the TCEQ's rules.
- 46. CSWR-Texas has the technical and managerial capability to provide continuous and adequate service to the requested area.

### Ability to Serve: Financial Ability and Stability

- 47. CSWR, LLC, the immediate parent company of CSWR-Texas, is capable, available, and willing to cover temporary cash shortages, and has a debt-to-equity ratio of less than one, satisfying the leverage test.
- 48. CSWR, LLC provided a written guarantee of coverage of temporary cash shortages and demonstrated that it has sufficient cash available to cover any projected operations and maintenance shortages during the first five years of operations after completion of the transaction and possesses the cash and leverage ability to pay for capital improvements and necessary equity investments, satisfying the operations test.
- 49. CSWR-Texas demonstrated the financial capability and stability to provide continuous and adequate service to the requested area.

### Financial Assurance

50. There is no need to require CSWR-Texas to provide a bond or other financial assurance to ensure continuous and adequate service.

### Feasibility of Obtaining Service from Adjacent Retail Public Utility

- 51. Water Works is currently providing water service to customers and has sufficient capacity.
- 52. Obtaining service from an adjacent retail public utility would likely increase costs to customers because new facilities would need to be constructed. At the minimum, an interconnect would need to be installed in order to connect to a neighboring retail public utility.
- 53. It is not feasible to obtain service from an adjacent retail public utility.

### Environmental Integrity and Effect on the Land

- 54. The requested areas will continue to be served with existing infrastructure.
- 55. There will be minimal effects on environmental integrity and on the land as capital improvements are made to enable CSWR-Texas to provide continuous and adequate service to the requested area.

### Improvement of Service or Lowering Cost to Customers

56. Water service to the requested area is expected to improve because CSWR-Texas intends to make upgrades, renovations, and repairs necessary to improve the safety and reliability of service.

57. The rates charged to customers in the requested area will not change as a result of the proposed transaction because CSWR-Texas will adopt the currently in effect tariff for the water system upon consummation of the transaction.

### Regionalization or Consolidation

58. The construction of a physically separate system is not necessary for CSWR-Texas to serve the requested area. Therefore, concerns of regionalization or consolidation do not apply.

### Maps, Tariff Pages, and Certificate

- 59. On March 6, 2024, Staff emailed to Water Works the proposed final map related to this docket.
- 60. On March 6, 2024, Staff emailed to CSWR-Texas the proposed final map, tariff pages, and certificate related to this docket.
- On March 14, 2024, CSWR-Texas filed its consent form concurring with the tariff pages, final map, and certificate, and filed Water Works' consent form concurring with the final map.
- 62. The proposed final map, relevant tariff pages, and certificate were included as attachments to the joint supplemental motion to admit evidence and proposed notice of approval filed on April 5, 2024.

### Informal Disposition

- 63. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice provided in this docket.
- 64. Water Works, CSWR-Texas, and Staff are the only parties to this proceeding following the withdrawal of the only motion to intervene.
- 65. No party requested a hearing, and no hearing is needed.
- 66. Staff recommended approval of the application.
- 67. The decision is no adverse to any party.

### II. Conclusions of Law

The Commission makes the following conclusions of law:

- 1. The Commission has authority over this proceeding under TWC §§ 13.041, 13.241, 13.242, 13.244, 13.246, 13.251, and 13.301.
- Water Works and CSWR-Texas are retail public utilities as defined by TWC § 13.002(19) and 16 TAC § 24.3(31).

- 3. The application meets the requirements of TWC § 13.244 and 16 TAC §§ 24.233 and 24.239.
- 4. The applicants provided notice of the application that complies with TWC §§13.246 and 13.301(a)(2) and 16 TAC § 24.239.1
- 5. The application meets the requirements of TWC § 13.244 and 16 TAC §§ 24.233 and 24.239.
- 6. The Commission processed the application as required by the TWC, the Administrative Procedure Act,<sup>2</sup> and Commission Rules.
- Water Works and CSWR-Texas have complied with the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.239(k) and (l) with respect to customer deposits.
- Water Works and CSWR-Texas completed the sale within the time required by 16 TAC § 24.239(m), as extended.
- After consideration of the factors in TWC § 13.246(c), CSWR-Texas demonstrated that it
  is capable of rendering continuous service to every customer in the requested area, as
  required by TWC § 13.251.
- 10. CSWR-Texas demonstrated adequate financial, managerial, and technical capability for providing continuous and adequate service to the requested area as required by TWC §§ 13.241(a) and 13.301(b).
- 11. It is not necessary for CSWR-Texas to provide bond or other financial assurance under TWC §§ 13.246(d) and 13.301(c).
- 12. Regionalization and consolidation concerns under TWC § 13.241(d) do not apply in this proceeding because construction of a physically separate water system is not required.
- 13. The applicants have demonstrated that the sale of Water Works' water facilities and the transfer of the water service areas held under CCN number 11674 to CSWR-Texas under water CCN number 13290 will serve the public interest and is necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience, and safety of the public under TWC § 13.301(d) and (e).

14. The requirements of informal disposition under 16 TAC § 22.35 have been met in this proceeding.

### III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with the preceding findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission enters the following orders.

- The Commission approves the sale and transfer of all facilities, customers, and service area held under Water Works' CCN number 11674 to CSWR-Texas's CCN number 13290, to the extent provided in this Notice of Approval and as shown on the attached map.
- 2. The Commission cancels Water Works' CCN number 11674.
- The Commission amends CSWR-Texas's CCN number 13290 to include the facilities, customers, and service area previously included in Water Works' CCN number 11674, as shown on the attached map.
- 4. The Commission approves the map and tariff pages attached to the Notice of Approval.
- 5. The Commission issues the certificate attached to this Notice of Approval.
- 6. CSWR-Texas must provide service to every customer or applicant for service within the approved area under CCN number 13290 that requests service and meets the terms of CSWR-Texas's water service policies, and such service must be continuous and adequate.
- 7. CSWR-Texas must comply with the recording requirements in TWC § 13.257(r) and (s) for the area in Llano County affected by the application and must submit to the Commission evidence of the recording no later than 45 days after receipt of this Notice of Approval.
- 8. Within 10 days of the date this Notice of Approval is filed, Staff must provide the Commission with a clean copy of the most current comprehensive tariff, including the tariff pages approved by this Notice of Approval, to be stamped Approved and retained by Central Records.
- The Commission denies all other motions and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted.
