**ORDER NO. 2
FINDING APPLICATION INCOMPLETE AND DEFICIENT, ESTABLISHING AN
OPPORTUNITY TO CURE, AND RESTYLING DOCKET**

This Order addresses the sufficiency of the May 23, 2022 application of Orbit Systems, Inc. and Undine Texas Environmental, LLC for sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Brazoria County.

On June 21, 2022, Commission Staff filed a recommendation on administrative completeness and notice and proposed procedural schedule.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the application administratively incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider an application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, at this time the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

On or before July 6, 2022, the applicants must supplement the application to cure the deficiencies as described in the June 21, 2022 memorandum of Ethan Blanchard and Kathryn Eiland. The ALJ notes that supplemental information was filed by Undine on June 21, 2022, but it is unclear if this filing cures the deficiencies. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot proceed. The applicants must not issue notice until the application is deemed administratively complete.

On or before July 20, 2022, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application, along with a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.

The docket style is corrected as reflected in this Order.
