DEFINITIONS

- **Staff 2-1** Please identify and quantify all incentive compensation costs (actual and estimated) included in the Company's EECRF administrative expenses separately by incentive compensation plan type for each of the 2021, 2022, and 2023 program years.
- For each type of incentive compensation identified in Staff's RFI Question No. 1-1 above, please identify and quantify separately the payments for operational performance measures and financial performance measures. For purposes of this request, consider any incentive compensation to be financially based if its payment or amount is based on, derived from, or calculated using inputs from a balance sheet, income statement, or other financial report.
- Please refer to the direct testimony of AEP witness Jennifer L. Jackson at page 8 lines 15-18 and provide the amount of financially based incentive compensation excluded from the calculation of AEP's 2021 over-recovery. Does AEP agree that all financially based incentive compensation should also be excluded from the calculation of any over- or under-recovery for program years 2022 and 2023?
