ORDER NO. 1
ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE AND
FILING AND SERVICE PROCEDURES

This Order addresses the June 10, 2022 application of Vexus to amend its state-issued certificate of franchise authority (SICFA) number 90011. Vexus seeks the amendment to reflect a change in ownership and control.

I. Procedural Schedule

Under PURA¹ § 66.003 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 28.6(d), the Commission must issue the SICFA before the 17th business day after the filing of a complete and sufficient application. Accordingly, the following procedural schedule applies:

Deadline for Commission Staff to file a recommendation regarding sufficiency and approval	June 24, 2022
Deadline for the Commission to find the application administratively complete; if deficient, deadline for the Commission to file an order resetting the procedural schedule	June 30, 2022
If application is found administratively complete, deadline for the Commission to file an order approving the application	July 6, 2022

II. Procedures

The Commission's procedural rules apply in this docket, unless otherwise specified. The Commission's rules are available at: www.puc.texas.gov.

All pleadings must state the project number assigned to this proceeding. Parties must file documents by 3:00 p.m. on the date due unless otherwise ordered.

Service of pleadings is typically governed by 16 TAC § 22.74. However, the Commission has issued a Second Order Suspending Rules,² which has suspended the service requirements found in 16 TAC § 22.74. As long as the Second Order Suspending Rules remains in effect, all parties must file any pleading or document with the Commission solely through the Interchange on the Commission's website (<https://interchange.puc.texas.gov/filer>) and provide notice, by email, to all other parties that the pleading or document has been filed with the Commission, unless otherwise ordered by the presiding officer. It will be incumbent upon all other parties to obtain a copy of the pleading or document by accessing the Interchange.

Unless otherwise specified, responses or replies to any motion or other pleading must be filed within five working days after the date on which the motion or other pleading was received by the responding party. Failure to file a timely response will be considered acquiescence to the relief requested.

All parties must provide their current address, **e-mail address**, telephone and fax numbers, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such information. Each party must provide the Commission and all parties with updated address, **e-mail address**, telephone, and fax information if such information changes. **The e-mail addresses**, telephone and fax numbers will be placed on the service list for the convenience of the parties. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of any other parties.

Questions concerning this Order or any other order must be submitted in writing, filed with the Commission, and served on all parties of record.
