ORDER NO. 7 REQUIRING CLARIFICATION AND SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION AND MODIFYING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This Order requires CSWR-Texas Utility Operating Company, George Fuller, executor of the estate of Virginia Fuller, and Commission Staff to provide clarification on two issues relevant to this application that were raised by the Commission at its October 6, 2022 open meeting during its discussion of Docket No. 52391. Specifically, the Commission discussed the following: (1) the requirements of 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.11(e)(5), and (2) the requirements of Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.244(d)(3) and what constitutes a capital improvement plan.

I. Substantial Addition and Capital Improvements

The requirements of 16 TAC § 24.11(e)(5) apply either when an applicant is proposing service to a new certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) area or a substantial addition to its current CCN area requiring capital improvements in excess of \$100,000. In this case, it appears CSWR-Texas is proposing to make a substantial addition to its current CCN area which will not require capital improvements in excess of \$100,000.

By January 27, 2023, the parties must jointly clarify the following:

1. Is CSWR-Texas proposing to make a substantial addition to its current CCN area with requiring capital improvements in excess of \$100,000?

2. If capital improvements in excess of \$100,00 are required, can applicants in a sale, transfer, or merger application use firm capital commitments to satisfy the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.11(e)(5) when 16 TAC § 24.11(e)(5)(A) appears to require loan approval documentation?

II. Capital Improvement Plan

Under TWC § 13.244(d)(3), an applicant for a CCN or an amendment to a CCN must provide a capital improvement plan, which must include a budget and estimated timeline for construction of all facilities necessary to provide full service to the entire proposed service area and must be keyed to a map showing where the facilities will be located to provide service.³ A pro forma budget is not a capital improvement plan under the TWC or the Commission's rules.⁴

After reviewing the record of this proceeding, it is unclear to the administrative law judge (ALJ) which documents constitute CSWR-Texas's capital improvement plan.⁵ Therefore, the ALJ requires the following:

- 1. By January 27, 2023, CSWR-Texas must identify the documents constituting its capital improvements plan; and
- 2. By February 3, 2023, Commission Staff must file a recommendation on whether CSWR-Texas has satisfied the requirements of TWC § 13.244(d)(3), consistent with the Commission's discussion at its October 6, 2022 open meeting.

III. Procedural Schedule

The ALJ modifies the procedural schedule as follows:
