Mr. Gorman's proposal to adjust ETI's authorized rate of return and related income tax expense will impact FERC Accounts: "Utility Operating Income" net income from accounts 400-435, and 409.1, Income Tax. Mr. Gorman's recommendation to reduce ETI's proposed return on equity (ROE) from 10.8% to 9.4% will reduce its claimed revenue deficiency by \$40,043,997.

Mr. Griffey's recommendation to deny ETI's requested ROE adder of 30 basis points would, based on Mr. Gorman's quantification, reduce ETI's claimed revenue deficiency by \$8,580,857 and would impact FERC Accounts: "Utility Operating Income" net income from accounts 400-435, and 409.1, Income Tax.
