**ORDER NO. 23  
GRANTING EXTENSION REQUEST**


In Order No. 22 filed on May 1, 2024, the administrative law judge (ALJ) required clarification on issues the following issues: (1) the requested area within the municipal boundaries of the City of Houston; and (2) the initial rates after acquisition.

On May 15, 2024, Commission Staff filed a supplemental recommendation on initial rates after acquisition. On the same day, Commission Staff filed a joint request for extension. Commission Staff states more time is needed to fully respond to the request for clarification in Order No. 22. Commission Staff represents the applicants are unopposed to the request for an extension.

The ALJ grants the request for extension. By May 29, 2024, the parties must (1) clarify whether Undine Texas, LLC made a formal request according to Houston's application requirements; and (2) identify the evidence in the record of this proceeding supporting the findings required by Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.245(c) and (c-1) or, alternatively, TWC § 13.245(c-2).
