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APPLICATION OF ROLLING V WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 3 FOR A CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY AND FOR DUAL CERTIFICATION WITH THE CITY OF RHOME IN WISE COUNTY PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION

OF TEXAS

COMMISSION STAFF'S FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On September 23, 2022, Rolling V Water Control and Improvement District No. 3 (Rolling V WCID No. 3) filed an application to obtain a water certificate of convenience and necessity (CCN) and for dual certification with the City of Rhome in Wise County. Rolling V WCID No. 3 filed supplemental information on October 21 and November 4, 2022, February 16, March 3 and May 9, 2023.

On April 27, 2023, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 9, directing the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice by June 9, 2023. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information and, as detailed in the attached memorandum from Jolie Mathis, Infrastructure Division recommends that the application remains incomplete from a managerial and technical perspective. Staff further recommends that Rolling V WCID No. 3 be ordered to cure the deficiencies identified in Ms. Mathis' memorandum by July 10, 2023 and that Staff be given a deadline of August 9, 2023 to file a supplemental recommendation on the administrative completeness of the application. Staff respectfully requests adoption of these proposed deadlines as some of the noted deficiencies are related to mapping information and Staff's mapping experts may be required to assist Rolling V WCID No. 3 regarding the supplemental mapping information needed to cure the mapping deficiencies and will require at least thirty days to review same.

II. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

In accordance with Staff's deficiency recommendation, Staff does not propose a procedural schedule for further processing of the docket at this time. Staff intends to propose a procedural schedule alongside a subsequent recommendation that the application be found administratively complete. Staff notes that Rolling V WCID No. 3 should not issue notice until the application is deemed sufficient.

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively incomplete, and that Rolling V WCID No. 3 be ordered to file supplemental information to cure the deficiencies in the application by July 10, 2023. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an order consistent with these recommendations.
