# COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On September 30, 2022, Monarch Utilities I LP (Monarch Utilities) and the CS Water Corporation (CS Water) (collectively Applicants) filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Bosque County, Texas, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.301 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.239.

On October 4, 2022, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 1, directing the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and proposed notice, and both applicants and Staff must file a recommendation regarding how to proceed with the application and propose a procedural schedule by October 31, 2022. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

#### I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information and, as detailed in the attached memoranda from James Harville, Infrastructure Division, and David Lopez and Fred Bednarski, Rate Regulation Division, recommends that the application is administratively complete. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a comment on the merits of the application.

#### II. NOTICE

At this time, Staff recommends that the Applicants proceed with providing public notice to all current customers, neighboring utilities, political subdivisions, and other persons listed in the attached memorandum using the notice form provided by Mr. Harville. Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that the Applicants provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area.

Once notice has been provided, Staff recommends that the Applicants file proof of notice as described in the attached memorandum, including an affidavit specifying the name and address of every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and a copy of the map provided with the notice. Finally, Staff recommends that the Applicants use the attached notice and affidavit to meet these requirements

### III. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete. Therefore, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

Deadline for Staff to file a recommendation on sufficiency of notice	December 12, 2022
Deadline to intervene	30 days after notice is issued

### IV. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete, that the Applicants be directed to provide notice as described in the attached memorandum, and that the proposed procedural schedule be adopted. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an order consistent with these recommendations.

On September 30, 2022, Monarch Utilities I LP (Monarch Utilities) and the CS Water Corporation (CS Water) (collectively Applicants) filed an application for sale, transfer, or merger (STM) of facilities and certificate rights in Bosque County, Texas, under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.301 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.239.

Monarch has an application in process (Docket No. 53636) at the Commission to change the utility name from Monarch Utilities I L.P. to Texas Water Utilities, L.P. Until that application is approved the legal utility name on file with the Commission is Monarch Utilities I L.P. When Docket No. 53636 is approved, and the name change is complete, the final approval will be filed in this docket so the name can be changed to the new utility name.

Specifically, Monarch Utilities, water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12983 seeks approval to acquire facilities and to transfer all of the water service area from CS Water under water (CCN) No. 11441.

Based on the mapping review by Tracy Montes, Infrastructure Division, the maps submitted with Item 10 on October 25, 2022 are sufficient.

- The requested area includes 178 customer connections and approximately 726 acres, comprised of transferred area from CCN No. 11441.
- The application proposes the subtraction of approximately <u>726</u> acres from CCN No. 11441 and the addition of approximately <u>726</u> acres to CCN No. 12983.

Based on the mapping review and my technical and managerial review of the information filed, I recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. I further recommend that the Applicants be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:
  - a. Cities, districts, and neighboring retail public utilities providing the same utility service whose corporate boundaries or certificated service area are located within two miles from the outer boundary of the requested area:
    - Brazos River Authority
    - Cedron Creek Ranch Water Supply (CCN No. 11659)
  - b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
    - Bosque County Judge
  - c. Each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
    - Middle Trinity Groundwater Conservation District
  - d. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

- 2) Provide notice using the attached notice form.
- 3) Provide a copy of the maps deemed sufficient during administrative review delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties and customers.
- 4) File in the docket copy of notice and the maps deemed sufficient during administrative review along with the signed affidavit specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided, and the date that the notice was provided.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to Monarch Utilities and CS Water. Monarch Utilities and CS Water will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond.

On September 30, 2022, Monarch Utilities I LP and CS Water Corporation filed an application for the sale and transfer of facilities and certificate rights in Bosque County under the provisions of Texas Water Code § 13.301 and 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.239.

We reviewed the answers provided to questions 4, 10, 11, 12, and 14 of the application. We did not identify any deficiencies in those answers for purposes of determining whether the application is administratively complete. Therefore, we recommend that the Commission deem the application administratively complete from a financial perspective.

The requested area includes approximately <u>726</u> acres, comprised of transferred area from CCN No. 11441.

The application proposes the subtraction of approximately <u>726</u> acres from CCN No. 11441 and the addition of approximately <u>726</u> acres to CCN No. 12983.

If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
