**ORDER NO. 3
GRANTING INTERVENTIONS**

This Order addresses the following motions to intervene:

City of El Paso	March 16, 2023
ChargePoint Inc.	March 17, 2023
Office of Public Utility Counsel (OPUC)	March 20, 2023

The City of El Paso is a duly incorporated home rule city served by El Paso Electric Company and is a regulatory authority having original jurisdiction over electric rates and service by El Paso Electric Company. El Paso has a right to participate which is expressly conferred by statute. The City of El Paso, ChargePoint, and OPUC have each presented a justiciable interest that may be affected by the outcome of this proceeding. No party filed an objection to the motions to intervene. Accordingly, the administrative law judge grants the motions to intervene.

For service of pleadings, the service list in this proceeding is available from the Public Utility Commission of Texas by emailing Docket Management at CADMOOrders@puc.texas.gov and requesting a copy of the service list in Docket No. 54614. **Service of pleadings is typically governed by 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 22.74. Accordingly, a filing party must provide notice by e-mail of any pleading or document filed. It will be incumbent upon all other parties to obtain a copy of the pleading or document by accessing the Interchange.**

All parties must provide their current address, **e-mail address**, telephone and fax numbers, if available, to all other parties and the Commission by filing and serving all parties with such information. Each party must provide the Commission and all parties with updated address, **e-mail address**, telephone, and fax information if such information changes. **The e-mail addresses**, telephone and fax numbers will be placed on the service list for the convenience of the parties. Parties are responsible for updating their own service lists to reflect changed information and the addition of any other parties.

Filing of pleadings is typically governed by 16 TAC § 22.71. However, the Commission's Second Order Suspending Rules suspended certain filing requirements found in 16 TAC § 22.71. As long as the Second Order Suspending Rules remains in effect, all parties must file any pleading or document with the Commission solely through the Interchange on the Commission's website (<https://interchange.puc.texas.gov/filer>) and provide notice, by e-mail, to all other parties that the pleading or document has been filed with the Commission, unless otherwise ordered by the presiding officer. It will be incumbent upon all other parties to obtain a copy of the pleading or document by accessing the Interchange.
