## ORDER NO. 6 FINDING NOTICE SUFFICIENT AND ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This Order addresses the sufficiency of notice for the March 14, 2023, application of CSWR-Texas Utility Operating Company, LLC and RBTQ, Inc. dba Southwest Gardens Water for the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights and for the decertification of Don Hays dba Southwest Water Company's CCN in Lubbock County.

On July 28, 2023 the applicants filed an affidavit of notice to current customers, neighboring utilities, and affected parties which stated that notice was mailed on July 12, 2023. Applicants filed the affidavit and a sample copy of the mailed notice, a copy of the name and address of every person and entity to which notice was provided, the date notice was provided, accompanied by maps in the docket within 30 days of the date of notice. In addition, the applicants included an affidavit of notice to landowners stating that the notice of the application was mailed to landowners on July 13, 2023. Specifically, the applicants filed the affidavit and a sample copy of the mailed notice, a copy of the names and addresses of the two affected landowners, the date notice was provided, accompanied by the maps in the docket, a map containing appraisal district information on landowner parcels overlayed with the requested area. Additionally, the applicants filed a notarized proof of publication attesting that notice was published in a newspaper of general

circulation in Lubbock County, *Lubbock Avalanche-Journal*, for two consecutive weeks, the last date of publication of notice was July 21, 2023.

On August 8, 2023, Commission Staff recommended the notice be deemed sufficient.

The administrative law judge (ALJ) finds the notice sufficient and establishes the following procedural schedule for continued processing of the application:

Deadline for parties to file a joint motion to admit evidence and a proposed order approving sale and allowing transaction to proceed	October 13, 2023
120-day deadline for the Commission to approve the sale or require a hearing	November 20, 2023 <sup>2</sup>
