JOINT SUPPLEMENTAL MOTION TO ADMIT EVIDENCE AND PROPOSED NOTICE OF APPROVAL

CSWR-Texas Utility Operating Company, LLC ("CSWR-Texas" or the "Company"), Circle R Ranchettes Property Owners Association ("Circle R"), and the Staff ("Staff") of the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") (collectively, the "Parties") file this Joint Supplemental Motion to Admit Evidence and Proposed Notice of Approval. In support thereof, the Parties show the following:

I. BACKGROUND

On December 7, 2023, CSWR-Texas and Circle R filed closing documents reflecting the consummation of CSWR-Texas's acquisition of Circle R's facilities and certificated area, plus a dually certificated area. Staff filed its recommendation on the sufficiency of closing documents on December 21, 2023, recommending that the application's closing documents be found sufficient.

II. JOINT MOTION TO ADMIT EVIDENCE

The Parties move to admit the following items into the record evidence of this proceeding:

- 1. The applicants' bill of sale and assignment filed on December 7, 2023;
- Commission Staff's recommendation on the sufficiency of closing documents filed on December 21, 2023;
- 3. The applicants' consent forms filed on January 30, 2024 and February 6, 2024, and
- 4. The maps, certificates, and tariffs attached to the joint supplemental motion to admit evidence and joint proposed notice of approval filed on February 13, 2024.

III. PROPOSED NOTICE OF APPROVAL

The Parties move for adoption of the attached Notice of Approval. CSWR-Texas has numerous pending dockets in which Commission Staff is required to send proposed final tariffs to applicants for review and consent. Each of these dockets is in a different stage of review and approval. As a result, a docket may produce an approved final tariff that includes systems that are still being addressed in another docket. This has caused significant confusion in the past and has necessitated numerous delays and tariff corrections across CSWR-Texas's dockets.

In an effort to address potential discrepancies and issues moving forward, Commission Staff respectfully recommends that after issuance of the Notice of Approval, the Commission require Commission Staff to file the most current comprehensive tariff with Central Records. The clean tariff filing will include the updated, approved tariff pages from that docket. In this instance, CSWR-Texas and Commission Staff submit the attached relevant tariff pages to add Circle R's facilities, rates, and service area under CCN No. 12298 to CSWR-Texas's water tariff under CCN No. 13290.

Since Commission Staff is uncertain as to when the Notices of Approval will be filed in each docket, it administratively simpler and efficient to seek approval of the relevant tariff pages for each docket and to then include the relevant information—added counties, if any, added subdivisions, and added rate schedules for the added subdivisions—in the comprehensive tariffs to be filed as clean copies with Central Records in each docket.

IV. CONCLUSION

The Parties respectfully request that the items listed above be admitted into the record of this proceeding as evidence and that the attached Proposed Notice of Approval be adopted. For convenience purposes, a copy is attached in its native format.



JOINT PROPOSED NOTICE OF APPROVAL

This Notice of Approval addresses the application of CSWR-Texas Utility Operating Company, LLC (CSWR-Texas or the Company) and Circle R Ranchettes Property Owners Association (Circle R) (collectively, the Parties) for the sale, transfer, or merger of facilities and certificate rights in Tarrant County. The Commission approves the sale and transfer of all water facilities held under Circle R's water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) number 12298 to CSWR-Texas, the cancellation of Circle R's water CCN number 12298, the amendment of CSWR-Texas's water CCN number 13290 to include the area previously included in Circle R's water CCN number 12298, and dual certification with Bethesda Water Supply Corporation (Bethesda), CCN No. 10089.

I. Findings of Fact

The Commission makes the following findings of fact:

Applicants

- Circle R is an investor-owned utility that operates, maintains, and controls facilities for providing water service in Tarrant County under CCN number 12298.
- Circle R is certificated to operate a public water system registered with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) as Circle R Ranchettes public water system number 2200148.
- CSWR-Texas is a Texas limited liability company registered with the Texas secretary of state under file number 0803367893.
- 4. CSWR-Texas is an investor-owned utility that operates, maintains, and controls facilities for providing water service in Angelina, Aransas, Austin, Burleson, Burnet, Calhoun,

Camp, Denton, Ellis, Erath, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Harris, Hays, Hidalgo, Hood, Jackson, Kerr, Limestone, Llano, Lubbock, McCulloch, Medina, Montague, Montgomery, Navarro, Orange, Parker, Polk, Robertson, Sabine, San Augustine, Tarrant, Victoria, Wilson, and Wood counties under CCN number 13290.

Application

- On April 18, 2023, CSWR-Texas and Circle R filed the application for approval of the sale and transfer of all facilities and service area held under Circle R's water CCN number 12298 to CSWR-Texas, cancellation of Circle R's water CCN number 12298, and amendment of CSWR-Texas's water CCN number 13290 to include the area previously included in Circle R's water CCN number 12298.
- CSWR-Texas filed an amended application on April 28, 2023, and supplemented the application on June 7, June 14, and July 20, 2023.
- 7. In the amended and supplemented application, CSWR-Texas and Circle R seek approval of the following transaction: (a) CSWR-Texas will acquire all of Circle R's water facilities and water service area under water CCN number 12298 (b) Circle R's water CCN number 12298 will be cancelled; and (c) CSWR-Texas's water CCN number 13290 will be amended to include the area previously included in Circle R's water CCN number 12298. Additionally, the application requests dual certification with Bethesda Water Supply Corporation (Bethesda), CCN No. 10089.
- 8. The requested area comprises approximately 28.2 acres, 0.6 of which will be dually certificated with Bethesda, and 48 customer connections.
- 9. The requested area is located approximately 5.2 miles northwest of downtown Mansfield, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by Sandy Lane; on the east by Teague Road; on the south by Rendon Bloodworth Road; and on the west by Rendon New Hope Road.
- 10. In Order No. 4, filed on July 12, 2023, the ALJ deemed the application administratively complete.

Notice

- On July 26, 2023, CSWR-Texas filed the affidavit of Aaron Silas, Director of Regulatory Operations at CSWR-Texas, attesting that notice was provided to all current customers of Circle R, neighboring utilities, affected parties, and indicated there are no landowners owning tracts of land over 25 acres wholly or partly inside the requested CCN area on July 21, 2023.
- 12. In Order No. 6, filed on August 29, 2023, the ALJ deemed the notice sufficient.

Evidentiary Record

- In Order No. 7, filed on November 14, 2023, the ALJ admitted the following evidence into the record: the application including all attachments filed on April 18, 2023; CSWR-Texas's amendment to the application filed on April 28, 2023; CSWR-Texas's first supplement to the application filed on June 7, 2023, CSWR-Texas's second supplement to the application filed on June 14, 2023; Commission Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness and notice and proposed procedural schedule filed on July 6, 2023; CSWR-Texas's third supplement, request for good cause exception and highly sensitive exhibits filed on July 20, 2023; CSWR-Texas's proof of notice filed on July 26, 2023; Commission Staff's recommendation on sufficiency of notice and good cause exception filed on August 25, 2023; and Commission Staff's final recommendation on approval of the sale filed September 19, 2023.
- 14. On February 13, 2024, the parties filed a joint supplemental motion to admit evidence.
- 15. In Order No. ___, issued on ______, 2024 the ALJ admitted the following additional evidence into the record: (a) the applicants' bill of sale and assignment filed on December 7, 2023; (b) Commission Staff's recommendation on sufficiency of closing documents filed on December 21, 2023; (c) the applicants' consent forms filed on January 30, 2024 and February 6, 2024, and (d) the maps, certificates, and tariffs attached to the joint supplemental motion to admit evidence and joint proposed notice of approval filed on February 13, 2024.

Sale

- 16. In Order No. 8 filed on November 20, 2023, the ALJ approved the sale and transaction to proceed and required the applicants to file proof that the transaction had closed and the customer deposits had been addressed.
- 17. On December 7, 2023, the applicants filed notice that the sale had closed on December 5, 2023, and confirmed that there were no outstanding customer deposits that needed to be addressed.
- 18. In Order No. 9, filed on December 27, 2023, the ALJ found the closing documents sufficient.

CSWR-Texas's Compliance History

- 19. CSWR-Texas has not been under an enforcement action by the Commission, TCEQ, Texas Health and Human Services, the Office of the Attorney General, or the United States Environmental Protection Agency in the past five years for non-compliance with rules, orders, or state statutes.
- The Commission's complaint records, which date back to 2017, show 12 complaints against CSWR-Texas.
- CSWR-Texas does not have a history of continuing mismanagement or misuse of revenues as a utility service provider.
- CSWR-Texas demonstrated a compliance history that is adequate for approval of the sale to proceed.

Adequacy of Existing Service

- 23. Currently, 48 customer connections in the requested area are being served by Circle R through public water systems number 2200148 and service has been continuous and adequate.
- 24. CSWR-Texas plans to make upgrades, renovation, and repairs to the system to return the system to compliance and to ensure that customers receive safe and reliable service.

Need for Additional Service

- 25. There is a continuing need for service because Circle R is currently serving 48 connections in the requested area and area to be dually certified.
- 26. There have been no specific requests for additional service within the requested area.

Effect of Approving the Transaction and Granting the Amendment

- 27. Approving the sale and transfer to proceed and granting the CCN amendment will obligate CSWR-Texas to provide continuous and adequate water service to current and future customers in the requested area.
- 28. There will be no effect on landowners as the area is currently certificated.
- 29. There will be no effect on any retail public utility servicing the proximate area because this application is to transfer only existing facilities, customers, and service area and all retail public utilities in the proximate area were provided notice of the transaction taking place in this application and did not request to intervene.

Ability to Serve: Managerial and Technical

- 30. CSWR-Texas owns and operates numerous TCEQ-approved public water systems.
- 31. CSWR-Texas employs or contracts with TCEQ-licensed water operators who will operate the public water system.
- CSWR-Texas has the technical, financial, managerial capability to provide adequate and continuous service to the requested area.
- 33. CSWR-Texas has access to an adequate supply of water and is capable of providing water that meets applicable state regulatory requirements.

Ability to Serve: Financial Ability

- 34. CSWR, LLC, the immediate parent company of CSWR-Texas, is capable, available, and willing to cover temporary cash shortages, and has a debt-to-equity ratio of less than one, satisfying the leverage test.
- 35. CSWR, LLC provided a written guarantee of coverage of temporary cash shortages demonstrating that it has sufficient cash available to cover any projected operations and

maintenance shortages in the first five years of operations after completion of the transaction and possesses the cash and leverage ability to pay for capital improvements and necessary equity investments—satisfying the operations test.

36. CSWR-Texas demonstrated the financial and managerial ability and stability to provide continuous and adequate service to the requested area.

Financial Assurance

37. There is no need to require CSWR-Texas to provide a bond or other financial assurance to ensure continuous and adequate service.

Feasibility of Obtaining Service from Adjacent Retail Public Utility

38. Circle R is currently serving customers and there will be no changes to land uses or existing CCN boundaries. Therefore, it is not feasible to obtain service from another utility.

Environmental Integrity and Effect on the Land

- 39. The requested areas will continue to be served with existing infrastructure.
- 40. There will be minimal effects on environmental integrity of the land as a result of CSWR-Texas's planned upgrades, renovations, and repairs to the public water system.

Improvement of Service or Lowering Cost to Customers

- 41. CSWR-Texas will provide improved water service to the existing customers in the requested area after completion of the planned upgrades, renovations, and repairs to the public water system.
- 42. CSWR-Texas will adopt Circle R's current rates upon the consummation of the transaction.

Regionalization or Consolidation

43. The construction of a physically separate system is not necessary for CSWR-Texas to serve the requested area. Therefore, concerns of regionalization or consolidation do not apply.

Tariffs, Maps, and Certificates

- 44. On January 22, 2024, Commission Staff emailed to the applicants the final proposed map, certificate, and tariff related to this docket.
- 45. On January 30, 2024 and February 6, 2024, the applicants filed their consent forms concurring with the proposed final map, certificate, and tariff.
- 46. The final map, certificate, and tariff, were included as attachments to the joint supplemental motion to admit evidence, filed on February 13, 2024.
- 47. It is appropriate for CSWR-Texas and Commission Staff to only propose the final tariff pages that are relevant to this docket for approval. Once approved, it is sufficient for Commission Staff to file the most current comprehensive clean tariff that includes the approved final tariff pages and information relevant to this docket within ten days of this Notice of Approval.

Informal Disposition

- 48. More than 15 days have passed since the completion of notice provided in this docket.
- 49. No person filed a protest or motion to intervene.
- 50. Circle R, CSWR-Texas, and Staff are the only parties to this proceeding.
- 51. No party requested a hearing, and no hearing is needed.
- 52. Staff recommended approval of the application.
- 53. The decision is not adverse to any party.

II. Conclusions of Law

The Commission makes the following conclusions of law:

- 1. The Commission has authority over this proceeding under TWC §§ 13.041, 13.241, 13.242, 13.244, 13.246, 13.251, and 13.301.
- CSWR-Texas and Circle R are retail public utilities as defined by TWC § 13.002(19) and 16 TAC § 24.2(31).
- 3. The Commission processed the application as required by the TWC, the Administrative Procedures Act, and Commission Rules.
- 4. The application meets the requirements of TWC § 13.244 and 16 TAC § 24.233.

- 5. The applicants provided notice of the application that complies with TWC §§ 13.246 and 13.301(a)(2) and 16 TAC § 24.239.
- Circle R and CSWR-Texas have complied with the requirements of 16 TAC § 24.239(k) with respect to customer deposits.
- Circle R and CSWR-Texas completed the sale within the time frame required by 16 TAC § 24.239(m).
- 8. After consideration of the factors in TWC § 13.246(c), CSWR-Texas demonstrated that it is capable of rendering continuous service to every customer in the requested area, as required by TWC § 13.251.
- 9. CSWR-Texas demonstrated adequate financial, managerial, and technical capability for providing adequate and continuous service to the requested area as required by TWC §§ 3.241(a) and 13.301(b).
- 10. It is not necessary for CSWR-Texas to provide bond or other financial assurance under TWC §§ 13.246(d) and 13.301(c).
- 11. CSWR-Texas and Circle R demonstrated that the sale of Circle R's water and sewer facilities and the transfer of the water and sewer service areas held under CCN number 12298 from Circle R to CSWR-Texas under water CCN number 13290 will serve the public interest and is necessary for the service, accommodation, convenience, and safety of the public under TWC § 13.301(d), (e).

III. Ordering Paragraphs

In accordance with the proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Commission enters the following orders:

- 1. The Commission approves the sale and transfer of all facilities held under Circle R's water CCN number 12298 to CSWR-Texas, as shown on the attached map.
- The Commission cancels Circle R's CCN number 12298.
- The Commission amends CSWR-Texas's water CCN number 13290 to include the area previously included in Circle R's water CCN number 12298, as shown on the attached map.
- 4. The Commission approves the map and tariff attached to the Notice of Approval.

- 5. The Commission issues the certificate attached to this Notice of Approval.
- 6. CSWR-Texas must provide service to every customer or applicant for service within the approved area under water CCN number 13290 that requests service and meets the terms of CSWR-Texas's water service, and such service must be continuous and adequate.
- 7. CSWR-Texas meets the requirements of TWC § 13.241(b) to provide water utility service.
- 8. CSWR-Texas must comply with the recording requirements in TWC § 13.257(r) and (s) for the area in Tarrant County affected by the application and must submit to the Commission evidence of the recording no later than 45 days after receipt of the Notice of Approval.
- 9. Within ten days of the date of the Notice of Approval, Commission Staff must provide a clean copy of the tariff approved by this Notice of Approval to central records to be marked Approved and filed in the Commission's tariff books.
- 10. The Commission denies all other motions and any other requests for general or specific relief, if not expressly granted.
