**ORDER NO. 6**  
**DENYING JOINT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**


This Order addresses the December 22, 2023 joint motion for extension of time filed by MC Trilogy Texas, LLC and RCH Water Supply Corporation. The parties request a 60-day extension of the December 27, 2023 deadline to file their respective appraisal reports.

Under Texas Water Code (TWC) § 13.2541(i) and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 24.245(i)(2)(b), each appraisal must be submitted within 70 calendar days after the date the petition is approved. Consistent with 16 TAC § 24.2(b), the administrative law judge (ALJ) may make exceptions to the requirements found in chapter 24 but not if the requirement is prescribed by statute. Because the 70-day deadline for filing an appraisal is prescribed by statute, the ALJ does not have the authority to grant an exception or extension of the 70-day deadline.<sup>1</sup>

The ALJ denies the joint motion for extension of time.
