To whom it may concern,

I do understand the need for new lines, yet ask that you consider locating them somewhere other than on the north side of 1171 crossing Canyon Falls Drive.

A location north of 1171 disturbs the beautiful greenbelt trails, creek, waterfall and native trees that are so rare in the area. In addition to disturbing the deer and other animals that live in that wooded strip close to the creek, the lines would cross the "curated" entrance into the addition.

Potential homebuyers have 3 other comparable neighborhoods in the immediate area to choose from. No buyer wants to tell their friends to "take a left off 1171 and go under the power lines" when they give directions to their new home. I consider lines damaging the greenbelt and fouling the neighborhood entrance aesthtics an assault on the value of my home.

Finally, running lines north of 1171 and across Canyon Falls Drive locates those lines very close to the new in-neighborhood daycare. I'm sure there are plenty of studys as to the validity of any health claims regarding power lines close to developing kids. Please lean toward caution by locating those lines on the south side of 1171. egithi aller Cynthia Allen
