Justin ONCOR Protest Comments

First of all, why is ONCOR adding more equipment when they aren't doing maintenance on the equipment that is here now? There are power lines almost against my backyard fence along with a pole. There are mature trees all round them with limbs growing around the lines and the pole. The pole is already leaning. We experience regular power outages and one huge power surge that killed most of my electronics and outlets which has cost me over \$3000 in repairs and replacements so far. I have communicated with ONCOR about these issues and they said they won't even come out to look at their lines until there is some sort of 'incident.' A fire would wipe out at least 2 blocks of homes.

And what about our health? Since they don't have a good record of maintenance, who's going to make them take the necessary safety and maintenance precautions?

The tree removal will greatly affect air quality. The removal of natural habitats will force wild animals into our neighborhood.

My residence is one block from the demolition line for Hardeman Estates. From an aesthetic consideration, I'll be looking at monstrous power units and be transported from a neighborhood to an industrial area. I will essentially lose resale value on my property. That's a huge hit for a retired person on a fixed income!

What about the hundreds of families that will be displaced? These families include children that will be removed from their homes, friends and schools!

It appears that ONCOR is concentrating on profit with no regard for the human factor!
