I am writing to express my concerns & opposition to the proposed installation of transmission lines in my neighborhood of Canyon Falls (specifically segments E8, F3 & C9). As a resident and owner in this community, I feel compelled to speak my concerns about this proposed project.


I want to emphasize the impact these transmission lines will have on the aesthetics of our neighborhood. Our community enjoys the scenic beauty here and the large-scale transmission lines would significantly impact the visual appeal of our community.

Additionally, there are serious concerns about the potential health risks associated with the electromagnetic fields generated by high-voltage transmission lines. Although scientific studies have produced conflicting results, sufficient evidence exists to warrant caution and investigation. I am concerned about the potential long-term health consequences that may have on families if the transmission lines are allowed to be installed in proximity to my property.

The proposed transmission lines pose a threat to the wildlife that exists in and around our neighborhood. Construction & maintenance of the proposed transmission lines would require removal of natural plants and terrain, disrupting the ecosystem, which would impact the wildlife that are living near our neighborhood. Protecting the environment and the wildlife that we enjoy currently is important to our community and should be honored.

Beyond the visual and environmental concern is the negative impact on the value of our properties. Numerous studies prove that proximity to high-voltage transmission lines leads to a decrease in home values. As a Seasoned Real Estate Agent, I know that many buyers are deterred from buying property near high-voltage lines due to perceived health risks and noise concerns. This will impact the values and perception of values for buyers as well as reflected in the Denton County Appraisal District evaluations.

I strongly urge the reconsideration of installation of the high-voltage transmission line segments E8, F3 & C9 and utilize different line paths.
