To PUC Commissioners Kathleen Jackson, Will McAdams, Lori Cobos, Jimmy Glotfelty, and others whom it may concern. This statement is with respect to the proposal transmission lines by Oncor designated in docket 55067. The link of concern is link J22 as it crosses FM road 156 and runs east to west. We would like to request intervenor status and propose that this link not be chosen in this route.



We were blessed to be able to purchase the outlined property (18025 Tydings) in red in Fall of 2020 and our mother-in-law was able to purchase the property immediate to the right of use (18023 Tydings) at the same time. The properties include multiple generations of our family including our great grandmother, grandmother, my wife, sister-in-law, our three children, our two nieces, and multiple animals. The property line is 281ft from each home and 186ft from the barn. The J22 line is shown to be routed right at our property line and any easement would extend a significant distance into the property. The proximity to our home and children is of great concern due to continued exposure to electromagnetic energy. An article from Brightsandz Clean Technology states that the passage of electrical current through a conductor uses extremely low frequency (ELF) radiation. ELF radiation is associated with an increase of childhood leukemia by 200% as well as other health issues including headaches, dizziness, fatigue, insomnia which can lead to hypertension, irritability, listlessness, decline in energy levels, and obesity. The article concludes that a safe distance for a home from a high voltage (230-400 KV) transmission line is 100 meters (approximately 328ft). Therefore, our home is NOT located a safe distance from the proposed J22 link. Should the J22 line be approved the extreme health risk would be unacceptable and would force us to leave the property that my children love so dearly and where we hoped to raise them and future grandchildren. In addition to the effect on our property, there is a multitude of properties equally affected by the J22 line, including some that the route is set to go extremely close or through their residence.



We certainly realize the need for expansion with the recent population growth in the area but the impact on our and our neighbor's well being is not worth this risk, not to mention the immense devaluation of our property. There is a plethora of routes that would have less impact on homes and their residents. There are multiple properties which are commercial, have unoccupied homes, or are well clear of residential structures. I have spoken with multiple residents who would be directly affected by the J22 route, and we stand strongly against this intrusion.

We ask you to please consider NOT choosing a route which includes the J22 link.
