I am a homeowner in Canyon Falls and am absolutely alarmed to hear of the possibility of Oncor power lines within Canyon Falls neighborhoods, our greenbelt areas, our rec center and dog park. The power lines will have a terribly negative impact on the residents' use of Canyon Falls as well as a detrimental effect on our home values. I can tell you that if this plan had been known before we built our retirement home, we would have found a different location than Canyon Falls. I am also concerned about the effect of additional lines on local wildlife and their movements through our beautiful area.
