COMMISSION STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION ON ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS AND NOTICE AND PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On July 26, 2023, Quadvest, LP (Quadvest) filed an application to amend its Certificates of Convenience and Necessity Nos. 11612 and 20952 in Harris County under Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 through 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 through 24.237. Quadvest filed supplemental information on July 28, 2023, August 16, 2023, and October 16, 2023.

On September 20, 2023, the administrative law judge (ALJ) filed Order No. 4, directing the Staff (Staff) of the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to file comments on the administrative completeness of the application and notice, and propose a procedural schedule by November 15, 2023. Therefore, this pleading is timely filed.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLETENESS

Staff has reviewed the application and supplemental information and, as detailed in the attached memoranda from Jolie Mathis, Infrastructure Division, along with that of David Lopez and Fred Bednarski III, Rate Regulation Division, recommends that the application is administratively complete. Staff's recommendation on administrative completeness is not a comment on the merits of the application.

I. NOTICE

At this time, Staff recommends that Quadvest proceed with providing public notice to all landowners, neighboring utilities, political subdivisions, and other persons listed in the attached memorandum using the notice form provided by Ms. Mathis. Along with each individual notice, Staff recommends that Quadvest provide an accurate map delineating the requested service area. Staff further recommends that Quadvest publish notice of the application for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in Harris County. Once notice has been provided, Staff recommends that Quadvest file proof of notice as described in the attached memorandum, including an affidavit specifying the name and address of every person and entity to whom notice was provided, the date that the notice was provided, and a copy of the map provided with the notice. Quadvest should also provide a completed publisher's affidavit and a copy of the newspaper tear sheets demonstrating publication. Finally, Staff recommends that Quadvest use the attached notices and affidavits to meet these requirements.

II. PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Staff recommends that the application be found administratively complete. Therefore, Staff proposes the following procedural schedule:

III. CONCLUSION

For the reasons detailed above, Staff recommends that the application, as supplemented, be found administratively complete, that Quadvest be directed to provide notice as described in Ms. Mathis' attached memorandum, and that the above proposed procedural schedule be adopted. Staff respectfully requests the entry of an order consistent with these recommendations.

On July 26, 2023, Quadvest, L.P. (Quadvest) filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) an application to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 11612 and sewer CCN No. 20952 in Harris County, Texas under Texas Water Code (TWC) §§ 13.242 through 13.250 and 16 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§ 24.225 through 24.237.

Based on the mapping review by Dave Babicki, Infrastructure Division, the revised maps and digital mapping data submitted with Item 6 on August 16, 2023 are sufficient.

Requested Area 1:

• The *requested area 1* includes 0 customer connections and approximately 207.1 acres, comprised of uncertificated area to amend (add) to Quadvest, LP (CCN Nos. 11612 & 20952).

Requested Area 2:

• The *requested area 2* includes 0 customer connections and approximately 187.9 acres, comprised of uncertificated area to amend (add) to Quadvest, LP (CCN Nos. 11612 & 20952).

Total Requested Area 1 & 2:

- The *total requested area 1 & 2* includes 0 customer connections and approximately 395 acres, comprised of uncertificated area to amend (add) to Quadvest, LP (CCN Nos. 11612 & 20952).
- The application proposes the addition of approximately 395 acres to CCN Nos. 11612 & 20952.

• The application indicates that the total acreage being requested is approximately 396 acres, however, the mapping review determined the requested area is approximately 395 acres.

Based on the mapping review and my technical and managerial review of the information filed by Quadvest recommend that the application be deemed administratively complete. I further recommend that Quadvest be ordered to do the following:

- 1) Provide notice of the application by first-class mail to the following:

 - b. The county judge of each county that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Harris County Judge
 - c. Each groundwater conservation district that is wholly or partially included in the requested area:
 - Harris-Galveston Subsidence District
 - d. Each landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres and is wholly or partly located in the requested area. Notice must be mailed to the owner of the tract of land according to the most current tax appraisal rolls of the applicable central appraisal district at the time the application was filed.
 - e. Any affected customers, and other affected parties in the requested area.

Proof in the form of a publisher's affidavit must be filed within 30 days of the publication date. The affidavit must state with specificity each county in which the newspaper is of general circulation. Within 30 days of the date the notice was mailed, Quadvest must file an affidavit specifying the notice that was provided to every person and entity to whom notice was provided and the date the notice was mailed.
- 3) Provide notice using the attached notice forms.
- 4) Provide a copy of the maps deemed sufficient during administrative review delineating the requested area with each individual notice to neighboring utilities, other affected parties, landowners and customers.
- 5) File in the docket:
 - a. A copy of the notices (1 example of each type of notice).
 - b. The general location and detailed maps deemed sufficient during administrative review.
 - c. The signed affidavits for published notice and mailed notices.
 - d. A list specifying every person and entity to whom notice was provided.
 - e. If there are multiple landowners provide:
 - i. A list of the applicable county appraisal district parcels located within the requested area. The list should include the following for a landowner of a tract of land that is at least 25 acres or more and is wholly or partially within the requested area;
 - 1. Each property ID;
 - 2. Landowner Name;
 - 3. Address; and
 - 4. The acreage owned by each listed landowner.
 - f. The publisher's affidavit and tear sheets for proof of newspaper publication.
- 6) Supplement the application with a copy of the approval letters for the plans for the new water treatment plant, facilities, and distribution system that will provide water service for the requested area from TCEQ once it is received. Quadvest must file the approval letter prior to Staff making a final recommendation on the application. The sewer service will be provided by the Binford Wastewater Treatment Facility, which has been approved by the TCEQ under Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) permit No. WQ0016100001.

Staff may determine that additional information is needed to make a final recommendation in this docket. If additional information is needed, Staff may send requests for information (RFI) to Quadvest. Quadvest will have 20 days from the receipt of the RFI to respond.
