**ORDER NO. 6**  
**FINDING APPLICATION REMAINS ADMINISTRATIVELY INCOMPLETE**  
**AND PROVIDING OPPORTUNITY TO CURE**

This Order addresses the sufficiency of the August 16, 2023 application of McLennan County Water Control and Improvement District No. 2 to obtain certificates of convenience and necessity (CCNs) in McLennan County and for dual certification of a portion of the City of Waco's CCN numbers 10039 and 20010. On August 18, 2023, January 26, and March 25, 2024, McLennan County filed supplemental information.

On April 26, 2024, Commission Staff filed its supplemental recommendation on administrative completeness and notice and proposed procedural schedule.

In Order No. 5 filed on April 30, 2024, the administrative law judge (ALJ) found the application remains administratively incomplete and deficient and provided the applicant with an opportunity to cure the deficiencies by May 27, 2024. To date, the applicant has not responded to Order No. 5 or attempted to cure deficiencies.

The ALJ finds the application remains administratively incomplete and deficient. Under 16 Texas Administrative Code § 24.8(d), the Commission does not consider the application filed until it makes a determination that the application is administratively complete. Thus, as this time, the application is not considered filed with the Commission.

By June 27, 2024, the applicant must supplement the application to cure the deficiencies as described in the April 26, 2024 memoranda of Jaspinder Singh and Fred Bednarski III, attached to Commission Staff's supplemental recommendation. Until the Commission receives and reviews the supplemental information, the application cannot be processed. The applicants must not issue notice until the application is deemed administratively complete.

Failure to respond to this order and cure the deficiencies may result in dismissal of this proceeding.

By July 26, 2024, Commission Staff must file a supplemental recommendation regarding the administrative completeness of the application, notice, and a proposed procedural schedule, if appropriate.
