ERCOT'S NOTIFICATION REGARDING THE UPCOMING TRANSITION OF LP&L'S CUSTOMERS TO RETAIL COMPETITION

Electric Reliability Council of Texas, Inc. (ERCOT) hereby files this notification that customers of the City of Lubbock, acting by and through Lubbock Power & Light, (LP&L) will begin transitioning to competitive Retail Electric Providers (REPs) on or about March 4, 2024. Customers will be transitioned to REPs based on LP&L's meter-read cycles, with the transition scheduled to be completed on or about April 1, 2024.

As of February 15, 2024, approximately 66% of customers had selected a REP, and customers continue to have the opportunity to choose a REP. Customers who do not choose a REP before their transition date will be placed on a month-to-month plan with a randomly assigned default REP chosen from a pool of three default REPs. These customers will continue on the month-to-month plan with their assigned default REP until they enter into a contract with a REP of their choice.

In addition, ERCOT anticipates that the operational changes needed to implement the Commission's recently issued Declaratory Orders in Docket Nos. 56119¹ and 56122² will be in place and effective when LP&L customers begin transitioning to REPs on March 4. ERCOT will file an additional notification with the Commission once the transition is complete or as the Commission may direct and is prepared to provide the Commission with any additional information it may request regarding this matter.
