Commission Staff will provide a high-level update for the four Texas Energy Fund initiatives (In-ERCOT Generation Loan Program, Completion Bonus Grant Program, Texas Backup Power Package Program & Outside ERCOT Grant Program). The Texas Energy Fund has made progress with all programs, and an overview of the program's achievements and upcoming milestones is attached in a brief two-page summary.

In-ERCOT Generation Loan Program

Finance upgrades and new construction of dispatchable generating facilities within the ERCOT power region.

 Adopted rules for In-ERCOT Generation Loan Program on 3/21/24

Accomplishments

- Launched online application portal, began accepting apps by 6/1 legislative deadline
- Reviewed 72 applications; 16 are currently in the Due Diligence phase
- Held 16 virtual kickoffs and 16 in-person executive meetings for due diligence

Completion Bonus Grant Program

Provide bonus grants in 10 annual installments for the completion of dispatchable electric generating facilities in ERCOT by certain dates.

- Application go-live on track for 1/1/2025
- Grant Agreement, Policies, Manual, FAQs drafted
- Staff is developing video tutorial for applicants

Outside ERCOT Grant Program

- Stakeholder Workshop held 11/13/24 for input into critical facility operations, package sizing, and ownership models





In-ERCOT Generation Loan Program

Provides low-interest loans to qualifying companies for the construction of new dispatchable electric generating facilities in the ERCOT power region or the expansion of existing facilities providing power to the ERCOT power region. At the August 29, 2024, PUCT Open Meeting, the Commission identified applications to advance to the due diligence phase of the application review process. Information about the applicants identified to proceed to due diligence is available in the TEF In-ERCOT Generation Loan Program Memoranda available on Interchange (Project No. 56896).





Where We Are Now: Due Diligence

In the due diligence phase, projects' creditworthiness and viability will be evaluated to determine their eligibility for TEF funding. This process encompasses assessing key areas, including but not limited to:










