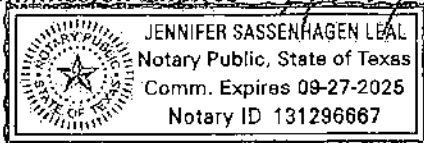

**NOTICE OF APPLICATION OF SJWTX, INC. DBA THE TEXAS WATER COMPANY TO AMEND ITS CERTIFICATE OF CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY TO PROVIDE WATER UTILITY SERVICE IN COMAL COUNTY, TEXAS**  
SJWTX, Inc. dba The Texas Water Company has filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to amend its water Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 10692 for the provision of retail water utility service in Comal County, Texas.  
The requested area overlaps the district boundaries of Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority. If this district does not request a public hearing, the Commission shall determine that the district is consenting to SJWTX, Inc. dba The Texas Water Company's request to provide retail water utility service in the requested area.  
**Requested Area 1:**  
The requested area 1 is located approximately 5.4 miles northeast of downtown New Braunfels, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by State Highway 46; on the east by State Highway 46; on the south by Countryside Drive; and on the west by Dry Comal Creek.  
The requested area 1 includes 0 customer connections and approximately 1,027.4 acres of uncertificated area to amend (add) to SJWTX, Inc. dba The Texas Water Company (CCN No. 10692).  
**Requested Area 2:**  
The requested area 2 is located approximately 6 miles northeast of downtown New Braunfels, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by State Highway 46; on the east by Farm to Market Road 1863; on the south by Farm to Market Road 1863; and on the west by Countryside Drive.  
The requested area 2 includes 0 customer connections and approximately 354.2 acres of uncertificated area to amend (add) to SJWTX, Inc. dba The Texas Water Company (CCN No. 10692).  
The total requested area (1-2) includes 0 customer connections and approximately 1,381.6 acres of uncertificated area to amend (add) to SJWTX, Inc. dba The Texas Water Company (CCN No. 10692).  
The application proposes the addition of approximately 1,381.6 acres to CCN No. 10692.  
A copy of the maps showing the requested area are available at: 6000 FM 2673, Canyon Lake, TX 78133.  
Persons who wish to intervene in the proceeding or comment upon action sought should contact the Public Utility Commission, P.O. Box 13326, Austin, Texas 78711-3326, or call the Public Utility Commission at (512) 936-7120 or (888) 782-8477. Hearing- and speech-impaired individuals with text telephones (TTY) may contact the commission at (512) 936-7136. The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is (30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer). You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date. The letter must include the person's name, address, email address and fax number if applicable.  
If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for a final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.  
A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from the requested area ("opt out") within (30) days from the date that notice was provided by the Utility. All opt out requests must include a large-scale map, a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land, landowner's name, address, email address and fax number, if applicable.  
A landowner that opts out from the requested area releases the applicant's obligation to provide retail water or sewer utility service to the removed land for any reason.

That cost may be "not only a hurdle but an impediment for someone who wants to teach and is called and equipped to teach," Leach said earlier this month during a committee hearing on HB 2.

House lawmakers are proposing to lower the financial barriers that keep Texans who want to become teachers from getting certified.

"Quality preparation takes longer, is harder and it's more expensive. In the past, we've given [uncertified candidates] an opportunity just to walk into the classroom," said Jean Streepey, the chair of the State Board for Educator Certification. "How do we

Even with the financial help, lawmakers are making a tall order. In two years, the more than 35,000 uncertified teachers in the state would have to get their credential or be replaced with new, certified teachers.

"The shortages have grown to be so great that I think none of us have a really firm handle on the measures that it's going to take to turn things around," said Michael Marder, the executive director of UTeach, a UT-Austin teacher preparatory program.
